



REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT B/A KEITH D. HILL JANUARY 2020

Below is my report for the month of January 2020, presented to the Executive Board on January 29, 2020 and the Members on February 4, 2020 during the Mass Membership Meeting.

RUN/SYSTEM PICK:

- In the next few months Bus Operators will be busy with several picks:
 - ✓ The "System Pick" will take place March 7, 2020.
 - ✓ The "Run Pick" will take place April 4, 2020 and will go into effect April 19, 2020.

Going as far back as the "System Pick" of 2008, the Union and CTA have been going back and forth with issues of the picks. Paying operators to learn new routes (line ride) and allowing enough time to learn the routes while working. After an arbitration award and a few meetings to modify the award, two "System Picks" ago, we established how to get paid and how long it should take to get paid.

- If you are transferring locations and you are not able to ride with the Instructors, no matter what route, be sure to tap your work ID on and off the bus. By tapping your ID this will prove the length of time you were on the bus and the fact you rode the line to be paid. To avoid anyone being charged for not riding the routes, six weeks will be allowed to complete your line rides.
- Also, the CTA will be changing two terminals that will affect three routes:
 - ✓ The #157 will now terminate at the pink line on Pulaski. This will allow our members a place to relieve themselves and have a place to rest over.
 - ✓ The next change will be on the #52 out of Kedzie garage, which will be cut short and run between Chicago Avenue and 63rd Street.
 - ✓ The #94 out of 74th Street Garage will be extended from Chicago Avenue and Troy to Addison and California, this will be an extension of the route and make it longer.

We have some concerns about all the routes and the changes. We expressed our concerns about the lighting at the **Pink Line** and did they fix the turn around so the buses can be seen? The other two concerns we had were about the man power for both locations. Please alert the Union of any concerns you have as we make our way through these two phases of the pick.

SECURITY MEETING:

With the up-rise of violence on the buses and trains, Local Unions 241 and 308 had a meeting with the President of CTA, the head of CTA security detail, and the Commander of Public Transportation. In this meeting both Unions expressed the fact that collectively, we move 1.5 million passengers a day and this comes with many challenges every day.

A few things we requested of the CTA were:

- ✓ A light a driver can have on the top of the bus to alert passing police to stop and check on the bus.
- ✓ Fight to get felony charges applied against anyone for assaulting an employee.
- ✓ Enlarge and place more warning signs of the penalties for assaulting an employee.
- ✓ Placing pictures of people who commit crimes on a monitor on the train and buses (brought up a lot of questions).
- ✓ Using the annunciator to remind people of the penalties for committing a crime on the system.
- ✓ A crisis team to assist a member after an incident occurs.

In this meeting we also found out Mayor Lightfoot has given CTA (178) officers everyday just for the system to be paid out of the city budget and not CTA. This is in addition to the officers that are in cars which is coming out of CTA's budget, which range from 40 to 50 a day. After hearing all of this, Local Union 241 still expressed the lack of presence and visibility enough to make a difference or stop any crime. Local Union 241 also explained how we feel about how things are handled when they show up to a scene to assist us. I'm not totally happy with what I heard, but it's a start.

The Local will keep pushing because safety is what we deserve as we do our job. The Local will be doing Rap sessions with the Commander of Public Transportation at all locations starting in February.

RED LIGHT:

- I have completed the latest round of the Red-light settlement. I'm still working to get the Union a seat at the table, when the determination is being made to accelerate the discipline.

RED LIGHT (CONT.):

- The Local will be handing out (39) checks to members who were skipped over in the repayment of days lost for a red-light. If you lost one day you will be paid one day, if you lost three days you will be paid two days back.
- We are still trying to reopen the discharged cases and bring some of our members back. All discharged red-lights were closed out in 2016 and agreed with CTA if you didn't hit your brakes to leave, you were discharged. Two things here, this is not what the original award stated and it is unfair to the members with a good record so bear with me as I work to fix that.

PRE-ARBITRATION AND EXPEDITED ARBITRATION:

- Pre-Arb and Expedited will resume in the month of February for both. The Local did have a few meetings with CTA where we were able to return two mechanics and four operators.
- The CTA is going to State court to vacate an arbitration award regarding the use of electronic devices while operating a vehicle, won by the Union saying it is against the law and a disregard for public policy.

PACE NORTH SHORE AND PACE WEST:

- We had a Labor Management meeting at PACE North Shore to resolve a few grievances. Also, the Steward brought up the conditions of the equipment, relief cars and a major safety concern with a bus stop. We are looking and waiting on results of the bus stop change.
- Pace West has set a date for their Labor Management for February and we have a lot to cover, an update will be provided to the members next month.

CONTRACT TALKS UPDATE (CTA):

- We have met with the CTA three times and they have canceled one meeting this month due to sickness.
- In these meeting we exchanged joint proposals and in our breakout session we expressed things that only concerned us, from the Station Clerks to Bus Supervisors, the Warehouse Workers in 901, the Labor Department, members in Area 629, part timers, full timers and the mechanics.

SLEEP APNEA ISSUES:

Issues affecting our members pertaining to testing for sleep apnea have been brought to my attention. We have had preliminary meetings with the CTA regarding this issue. We have further meetings planned in order to reach an understanding regarding this issue to protect our members' rights. However, I want to update you all so you can be prepared to protect the members.

Sleep apnea is a medical condition that is recognized that without proper treatment is a condition that can interfere with the ability of the operator to safely drive a bus. Therefore, the CTA can require members with sleep apnea to be treated.

The problems that have arisen involve under what circumstances the CTA can require a member to be tested. There are various circumstances:

1. What happens if there is a customer complaint or report of sleeping?

The CTA originally took the approach that any complaint regarding an operator sleeping could subject a member to testing, but we fought that issue. Now if there is a customer complaint about sleeping, the member is not to be immediately taken out of service and submitted for testing. Rather, the hard drive is to be pulled and if the sleeping cannot be verified the member is not to be submitted for testing but is to be returned to service without any loss in pay or a sick book entry. Therefore, it is important that you immediately get on top of the situation where this issue arises.

2. What happens if there is confirmation of sleeping?

The CTA in that circumstance can forward the member for evaluation by Concentra for sleep apnea and if the doctor under the circumstance believes the member may be suffering from sleep apnea, the member can be forced into the sick book and required to undergo testing for sleep apnea.

3. What are the consequences of a positive test?

The member will not be allowed to return to work until the examining physician certifies the return.

SLEEP APNEA ISSUES (CONT.)

4. What are the consequences of a negative test?

This is one of the issues that has not been resolved. It is the Union's position the member should be reinstated without loss of pay, have any sick book entry removed, and be compensated for any costs of the test. We are meeting on this issue.

5. Under what other circumstances can a member be tested?

- a. Any time a member returns and has to undergo a medical examination by Concentra, such as returning from 605 or transitioning to full time, or there is evidence of sleeping on the job, such as found sleeping on the job, the member can be sent to Concentra for further medical evaluation for testing, and if the doctor under the circumstance believes the member may be suffering from sleep apnea, the member can be forced into the sick book and required to undergo testing for sleep apnea.
- b. The Concentra doctor will evaluate the employee and will apply certain factors such as:
 1. If the member has a BMI (body mass index) over 40.
 2. If the member has a BMI (body mass index) over 32 and has some or all of the following:
 1. Family history of sleep apnea.
 2. Small upper air way.
 3. Overweight.
 4. Large neck size (over 17 for men and 16 for woman).
 5. Being over 40 years old.
 6. Excessive day time sleepiness.

6. Can the Union challenge the Concentra doctor's determination?

Only if a medical evaluation of condition was not made by a physician. A grievance can be filed challenging that the testing was arbitrary if a medical evaluation was not made. Concentra almost in all cases performs an evaluation but as critical as anything, are the employee's answers to questions.



7. What are the consequences of a negative test?

As mentioned before this issue has not been resolved. It is the Union's position that the member should be reinstated without loss of pay, have any sick book entry removed, and be compensated for any costs of the test. We are meeting on this issue.

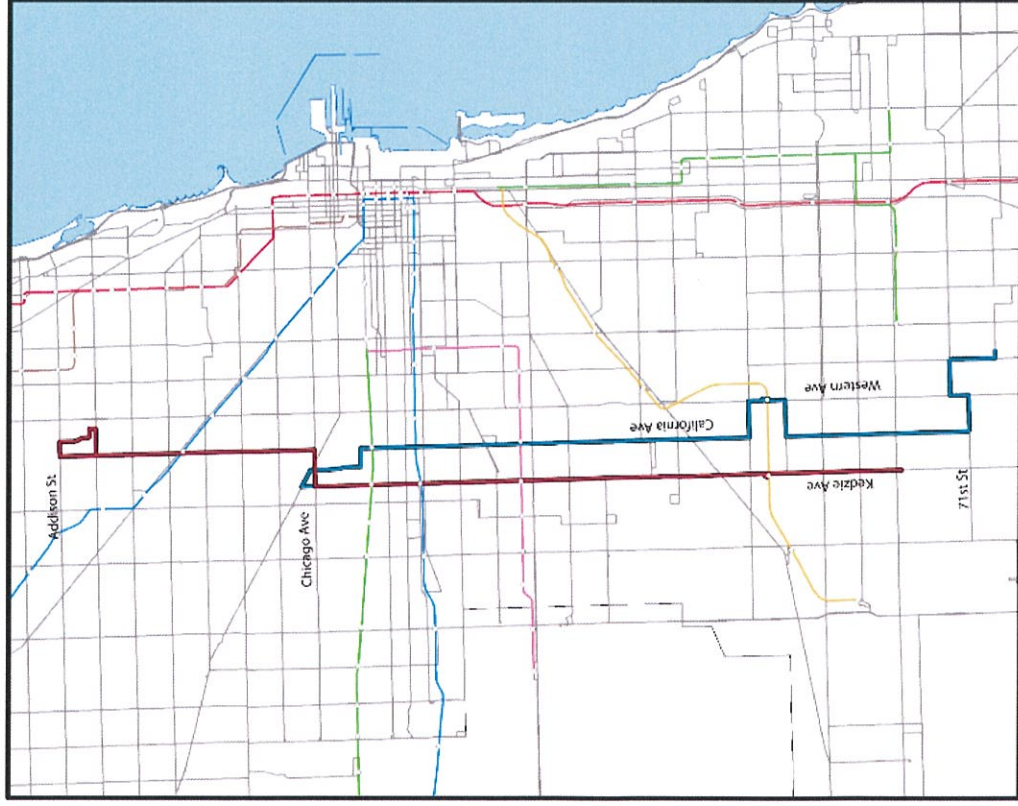

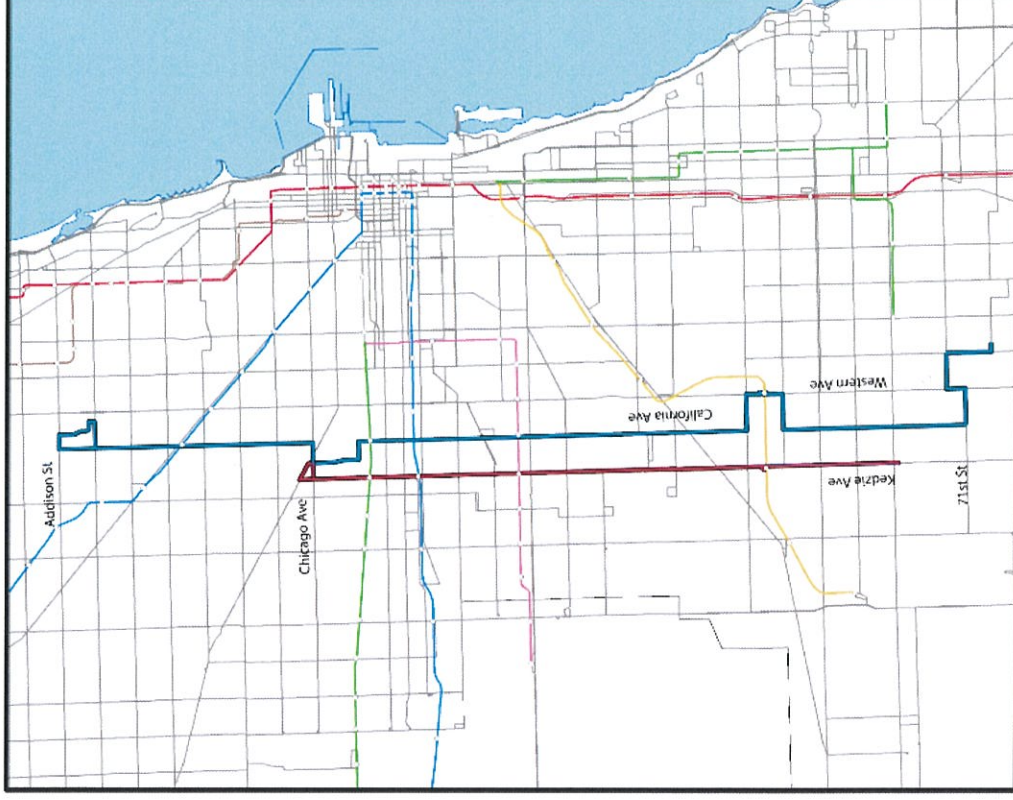
PROPOSED SERVICE CHANGE

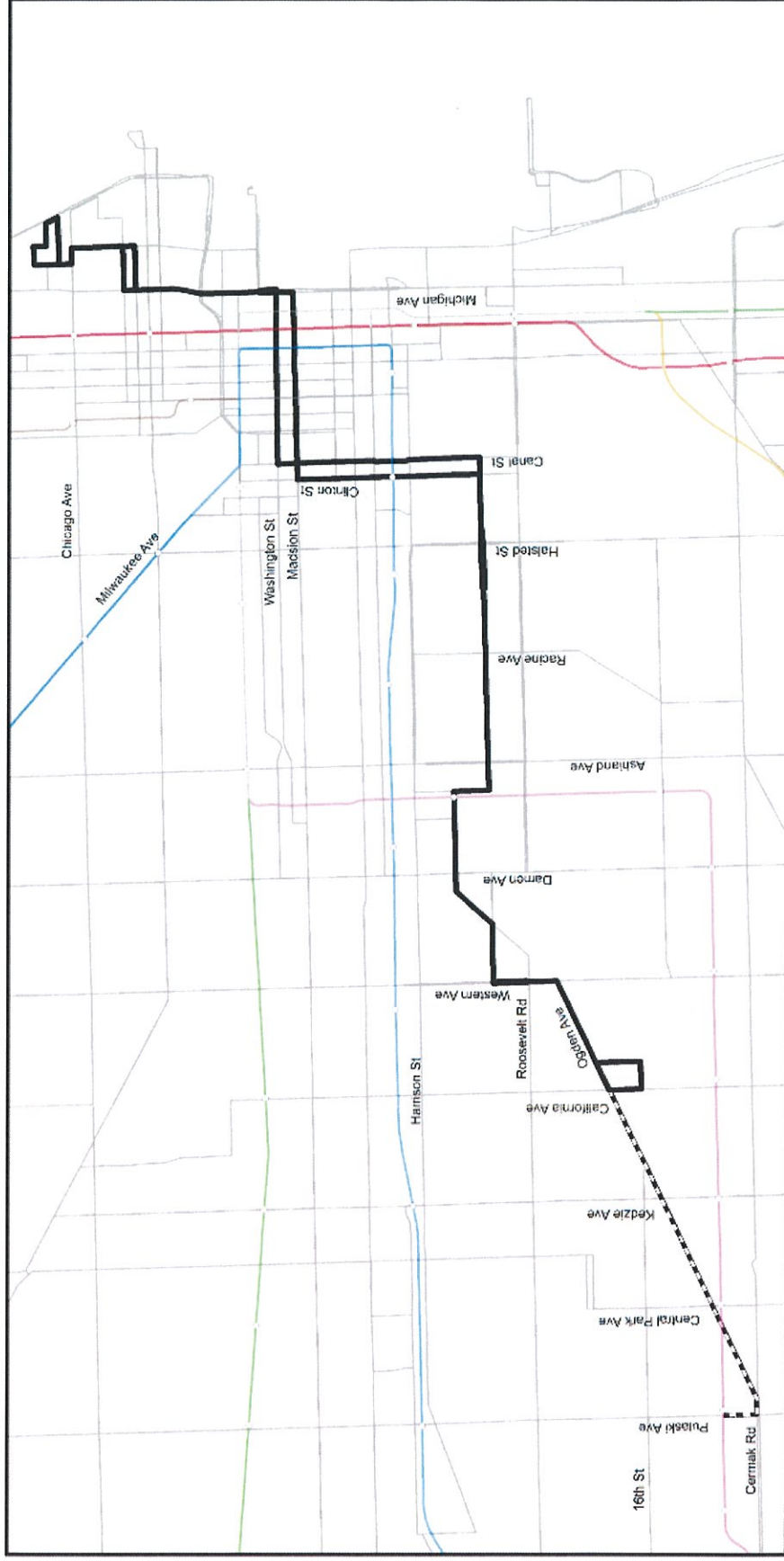
#52 Kedzie/California

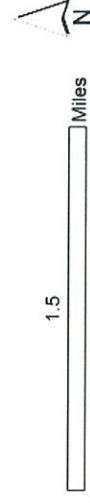


#52 Kedzie

ATU SECURITY BREACH

On January 6, 2020 my office received email correspondence from the ATU International explaining that they were in receipt of November's Per Capita payment, but had yet to receive October's Per Capita payment. It was stated by ATU International that this error was caught because it was "odd for Local 241, and they wanted to reach out to Local 241 to make sure that the October report had indeed been forwarded." I immediately set up an ongoing investigation. Here are the current findings of Local 241 as of the date of this report.

- In November our office staff mailed all the bills them inside of the U.S Post Office as normal.
- The October 2019 Per Capita check and our Xerox check had cleared our account. Stop payments were placed on the 9 other outstanding checks that were mailed on the same day.

- Upon further investigation it was found that the October Per Capita check and the Xerox check had been intercepted and is now under investigation. According to our bank records, the October 2019 Per Capita check and the Xerox check had been deposited and cashed.
- The Post Office, Law Enforcement, Amalgamated Bank, The ATU International, and Local 241 are investigating. All parties involved are cooperating with this investigation. Safe guards have been put in place to secure Local 241 Finances.
- Local 241 has resubmitted Octobers' Per Capita payment to the ATU International and is current on its Per Capita as of the date of this report.

INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

On January 7, 2020, The ATU International President John A. Costa was in attendance for the swearing-in ceremony of our newly elected Board Members and Stewards. This will be the first full 3 year term since the last trusteeship. Please familiarize yourself the Board Member and Steward for your location. Remember the member is our first line of defense.

PENSION & RHCT BOARD MEETING

On January 23rd, I attended our regularly scheduled trustees meeting for the Pension and RHCT. Employee contribution 13.324% and the CTA contribution is 26.647%. Please take the time to make sure that all your information, including beneficiaries has been updated.

ATU LOCAL 241 AUDIT

Our regularly scheduled audit that began on January 27, 2020, is still in progress. As always, the Executive Board and the membership will be notified of the results as soon as they become available.

GARAGE VISITS

During the month of January, I visited 2 garages. 77th Street Garage and 74th Street garage. I would like to send a special shout out to the 74th Street Garage who displayed class and hospitality to our International President John A. Costa, who visited that location while he was in town. The operators really gave him a warm well. President Costa also visited the Maintenance Department.


OPEN GRIEVANCES

My part of it was to talk about reading interview records and identifying the mistakes of management as well as Corrective Action Guidelines, because they also make mistakes. We went over the "Extra Board" violations, because this is continuously happening at certain garages. Board Members, please don't relax, because they think we are on this situation just for the moment, but that's a lie! **We will be watching it to the end!!!!**

I attended meetings about the upcoming "System Pick", which will be held on March 7-9, 2020. "Pick of Runs" will start on April 4, 2020 and will go into effect on April 19, 2020. Part-timers T.B.A.

I attended "Contract Negotiations". We are still giving CTA our proposals and talking about putting more *language* for Clerks, Supervisors and Instructors, in the contract.

DRUG HEARINGS

I attended Drug Hearings in the month of January 2020.

❖ **Shy Bladder-4 Cases**

Shy Bladder Syndrome is a type of phobia in which a person is unable to urinate in the real or imaginary presence of others. Such as in a public restroom is also known as "Paruresis". They may also have difficulty urinating on demand for random drug tests.

❖ **Ecstasy/Molly-2 Cases**

Methylenedioxy methamphetamine is a psycho active drug, primarily used as a recreational drug that causes altered sensation, increased energy, empathy and pleasure. Effects begin 30 to 45 minutes after ingesting and last 3 to 6 hours.

❖ **Reasonable Suspension Test-1 Case**

Tested positive for alcohol.

❖ **FTA Random Drug Test-2 Cases**

Tested positive for marijuana.

Results:

- ✓ 1 employee resigned
- ✓ 2 employees entered SAP Program

❖ **January 2018 FTA Regulations**

Drug testing went up and 50% of the membership will be tested by way of:

- ✓ Pre-Employment
- ✓ Random Drug Testing
- ✓ Reasonable suspension/Reasonable cause.
- ✓ Follow-ups

Violation of FTA Laws and Policy can lead up to termination!

We found out that mental health and substance abuse findings are 1 in 5, who will suffer mental illness and approximately 7 million in the United States and 500 thousand are unable to work per day. Once again, HEMP OIL and MARIJUANA are varieties of cannabis growth for different purposes. We can't always control what is going on around us and may need some tools to help in dealing with everyday life. **Call EAP (Employee Assistance Program) 1-888-371-1125.** Please, just remember, we are working in a **Safety Sensitive Operation.**

PENSION MEETING

- ✓ The Pension Fund is at 1.9 billion-54% Funded and members contributed 13.324% and CTA contributed 26.648%.
- ✓ HRCT Fund is at 978 million-118% funded and members contributed 3%.

PARTICIPANT IN THE RETIREMENT PLAN OR ELIGIBILITY FOR DISABILITY PLAN

- ❖ 5-years pension service for injury or illness that is work related.
- ❖ 10-years pension service for illness that is not work related.

Calculating your retirement benefits:

Years of service times 2.15 times highest 4 years equals = estimate payment.

Assistant Business Agent – Maintenance Report

My Name is Marqueal L. Williams I am the Assistant Business Agent for Local Union 241, this is my report for the Month of February. CTA, PACE, and FIRST TRANSIT.

Management Viewing Camera

Management had several meetings with the employees about pulling (2) two random hard-drives a night and viewing them, and telling the employees that they will be discipline upon discovery of the video. The Management team at 77th Street Garage also disciplined the employee from what they found during watching the video.

During a Shared Interest Meeting at CTA Headquarters Union President Keith Hill brought to CTA attention that Management are disciplining Operator on what they saw on a video hours before the event other than what that hard drive was pulled for. Maintenance General Manager Bryan Robinson clearly stated that “We do not go backwards and watch the entire hard drive they start ten minutes from when the event occurred and 10 minutes after the event end”.

Now the same General Manager who said they don’t pull hard-drives to discipline employees are telling management to do exactly what he says is not CTA policy.

MEMBERS let me tell you that Management cannot pull the hard drive without having someone to witness a complaint of the event in question. If management saw you speeding, then yes CTA have the right to pull the hard drive and use it for discipline purposes. Upper Management has advised General Manager Bryan Robinson and his Management Team at 77th Street Garage know that they are not to Randomly Pull Hard-Drives. And the employee who was discipline, the discipline was removed from his work record.

Complaints

If you feel you are being harassed, that’s because you are! There are a few things you need to know and do. Carry a note pad, this way when you are being harassed you can note it. Write down the time and date of the incident. Be very clear and detail about the facts. In most cases it’s your word against Management, so build your case against them, get statements from other members (on a report to manager preferably), the more information you can provide the better.

When you have established some harassment fill out a Report to Manager or a Speed Letter, this will start the paper trail and show you brought it to the attention of the management staff. Thru in-house mail send copies to the General Manager. If you get no results or not happy with the results, give a copy to me. Please remember you can never refuse a direct order, **unless you think it is unsafe to do.**

If you do not agree with the order ask for a Speed Letter or a Report to Manager, write a statement in regards to why you disagree with the direct order, or that you feel you're being harassed and ask them to sign it. If they refuse note that, and send it to the General Manager thru in-house mail. Remember to keep your cool at all times, all your actions will be securitized, just like manager build cases against members, we can build cases against managers harassing our members. I had a member that was terminated Friday January 24, 2020 but before the termination we had the member go to EEOC, and Monday January 27, 2020 that member was place back to work, from the recommendation of EEOC. This was possible by building a case on management.

Pension and RHCT

As of January 23, 2020, the Pension Plan funding is \$1,900,197,154.09 the Multiplier Factor for retirement is .0215%. The Pension contribution is scheduled to increase January 1, 2020 from 12.010 to 13.324%, during the 2018-year investment returns fell below 8.25%.

December of 2019 the plan did meet the 8.25% of return so in January 1, 2021 the pension contribution will remain at 13.324%. For more Pension contribution information of funding you can follow this link [40ILCS5/22-101e](#). The Authority contribution is 20.647%.

As of January 23, 2020, the Retiree Health Care Trust Plan funding is \$945,862,202.75 the Health Care Trust contribution is not scheduled to increase, it will remain at 3%, this plan is well over 100% funded. To check every penny that you put into the Health Care Trust from your paycheck go to www.groupadministrators.com, then enter your Social Security Number as your ID. And then enter your Badge Number for your Password, it will show you the Year to Date amount that you contributed into this fund. You should then check all your end of the year check stubs dating back from 2008 until present to make sure the total amount is accurate. This concludes my Assistant Business Maintenance Report

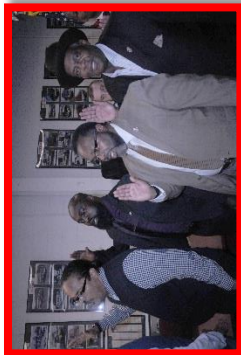
