Below is my report for the month of July 2022, presented to the Executive Board on July 29, 2022 and the Members on August 2, 2022 during the Mass Membership Meeting.

Local 241 has opened an internal and external investigation dealing with checks that have been mailed from the Union office to members. The office of the Financial/Recording Secretary is working closely with Amalgamated Bank and the Chicago Police Department to get to the bottom of this matter. When more information from the investigation is given to me, I will pass it on to the members of Local 241.

SAFETY MEETING:

- In the month of July, we had a safety meeting and rap session at 77th St. garage. In this rap session members had a chance to express their concerns about safety along several routes and hotspots they face while driving.
- This meeting was a good start in repairing the relationship between the operators and the Chicago Police Department.
- We will be holding other meetings at other locations in the upcoming months, so please have your hotspots and trouble spot concerns ready to address please look for bulletin about the meeting at your location.
- CPD has agreed to address trouble spots that the Union brings to their attention. We need the members to step up and help us with their concerns so we can voice them as well. Safety will remain the major concern for this administration. Please voice them to us so we can help you.

PACE WEST:

- We've had several rounds of contract negotiations with PACE management. As of today, Local 241 has over 31 tentative agreements. We are working hard to bring the members an agreement with no losses or givebacks.
- As of today, we have less than 10 open items remaining to negotiate. Local 241 will keep working to bring the members a respectable agreement.
- Brothers and Sisters of Pace West please remember safety is very important for ourselves and for our passengers. Please report all hot buses to Pace and the Union we would like to make sure the bus is being addressed before being sent back on the street.

PACE SOUTHWEST:

- I attended several meetings at Southwest during the month of July. During my visit I watched the drive cam for numerous operators. I must remind operators, when turning the bus, we can do no more than 7 miles per hour or it will trigger the camera. Any hard stopping will trigger the camera.
- We think the new cameras are a bit more sensitive than the old one's, we will keep watching videos as needed and keep asking PACE for coaching instead of charging the operator.
- I also represented a few members, who were facing discipline.

EXPEDITED AND PRE-ARBITRATION & LABOR CHARGES:

- In the Month of July Local 241 held "Expedited Arbitration" to address grievances. Local 241 addressed (75) grievances for the members of Local 241 winning (52) by way of an arbitrator's decision
- This administration will keep addressing the grievances and keep working to reduce the amount of time members must wait on receiving a final decision.
- We also took (12) cases to Pre-Arbitration: winning (0) in the month of July.
- Labor charges in the month of July: We had six (6) cases dismissed and one (3) new case brought against the Local.
- We also had (4) letters of complaints/charges written to the International Union office against the Local: (3) were responded to and all complaints/charges were dismissed and closed as unfounded.

LABOR MANAGEMENT MEETING:

- In the month of July Local 241 held three (3) labor-management meetings two (2) with Kedzie and three (1) with North Park garages.
- In these meetings we talked about the morale of the operators what can we do to change the environment at these locations. We also discussed grievances and talked about bullying operators during the interview process.
- Remember we are the managers' customer, and they should treat us with respect, if you feel this is not happening reach out to the Union.

STATE AFL-CIO CONFERENCE:

- Local 241 was well represented at the AFL-CIO convention in Rosemont, Illinois. This convention set the agenda for the state AFL-CIO for the next two years.
- I had the opportunity to work on a resolution with my good friend Bob Guy who represents Metra, this resolution addresses concerns about safety, COVID, cleanliness and guidelines for passengers. This convention also pushes the political agenda for Unions in the State of Illinois.
- Local 241 had (19) voting delegates to vote on all matters at this convention. It was a pleasure to be back representing Local 241 after a long absence from 2010. Another step to show that we are moving this Local in the right direction.

DNC CONVENTION:

- I had the pleasure of representing Local 241 in several meetings this month to get the Democratic National Convention to be held in Chicago.
- It was an honor talking with and meeting Democratic National Chair Jamie Harrison along with Congresswoman Robin Kelly, Chair of the Democratic Party of Illinois.
- This meeting allowed us the opportunity to seek the Chairs' support in our efforts to pass the Illinois Workers' Rights Amendment, select Chicago for the 2024 Chicago Democratic National Convention, and select Illinois as an **"early voting state"** in the 2024 Presidential Primary.
- This is another step for Local 241 as we keep building power in the city and the state.

JOB FAIR:

- On July 23, 2022 Local 241 and the Chicago Transit Authority held a second job fair.
- This job fair had over 600 people scheduled to attend, which is a good number for us to start our first in-person job fair.
- Local 241 has partnered with the CTA to assist in helping with the hiring, we see it as a way to help and give us an opportunity to get our family and friends hired.
- We will be holding another job fair in the coming months, hopefully in August. So please be on the lookout and let's help get our friends and family a job with us to earn a great living.
- I would like to thank the Officers, Executive Board Members and Stewards who represented Local 241 at this fair and everyone who helped put the word out about the fair. **Remember all jobs are now full-time positions!!**


BBS:

ATU International Convention

Our International Convention will be held in Las Vegas, Nevada on September 19-23, 2022. We will be holding our Delegate Election on August 2, 2022 for Convention Delegates. We ask that all of our members participate in the voting process. (5) Day and (15) Day Notices were sent out timely in order to notify the membership of the nominations meeting and election, in accordance with the ATU Constitutions and Bylaws.

PENSION/ RHCT

All bills have been paid and current. Pension and RHCT contributions have been paid. The regularly scheduled Pension and RHCT meeting will occur on July 28, 2022, after the date of this report.

DUES & ASSESSMENTS

Local 241 Sisters and Brothers, as you are aware, union dues increase implemented this year, per the ATU Constitution. This administration continues to absorb some of the increases recommended by the International.

CTA Members will receive 1157.52 in raises for the year of 2022. This is based on the salary of a bus operator at top pay and the 1.5% raise in January of 2022 and recently another 1.5% in July. There will be additional raises in 2023.

45th AFL – CIO Convention of Illinois

The 45th annual AFL – CIO Convention will take place in the Rosemont, Illinois on July 27-28, 2022. The Convention will offer the labor movement of Illinois the opportunity to discuss goals and shape the legislative agenda and political agenda for the next two years. On the agenda will be:

- 🚧 Discussion on the **Worker's Rights Campaign**
- 🚧 Plans for the **Labor 2022** statewide political program

GARAGE VISITS

I visited 77th Street and Chicago Ave Garages in the month of July. I was able to give and receive updates on member's issues. We also held meetings with the members of Local 241, the Mayor and leaders of the Chicago Police Department. We addressed our safety issues on the buses. We look forward to the continued commitment by our city officials to help keep our workforce safe.

CTA & LOCAL 241 CAREER FAIR

On Saturday, July 23, 2022, I attended a joint career fair with Local 241 and CTA. I would like to thank our Executive board and Stewards who were in attendance. We were informed that there were hundreds of applicants. This is just another step that the Local is taking to secure our livelihoods. Please watch the Union Board for important updates and announcements.

OPEN GRIEVANCES

There were 1750 open grievances for the month of July 2022. We are in the process of issuing awards that Local 241 has fought and won for the members.

I attended Step II hearings in the month of July 2022. There were 73 cases presented. 13 cases were resolved. The remaining cases will continue to move through the process.

We would also like to welcome some of our members back to work. With the hard work of this Administration, the members are seeing shorter wait times in to have their grievances resolved.

Mailed ATU Checks


Local 241 will be investigating the intercepting and cashing of our mailed checks. Although Local 241 believed that we had obtained an overall resolution to the issue, it was brought to our attention by a member that it might not be over. We were informed by this member that checks issued to the member had not been received.

From Local 241's perspective, all checks had cleared. We could not know, unless contacted by a member, that these checks were fraudulently intercepted and cashed. Since knowledge of the last breach, there were security mechanisms put in place. It was the explanation of the bank that because these checks did not appear to be altered, the fraud was undetected.

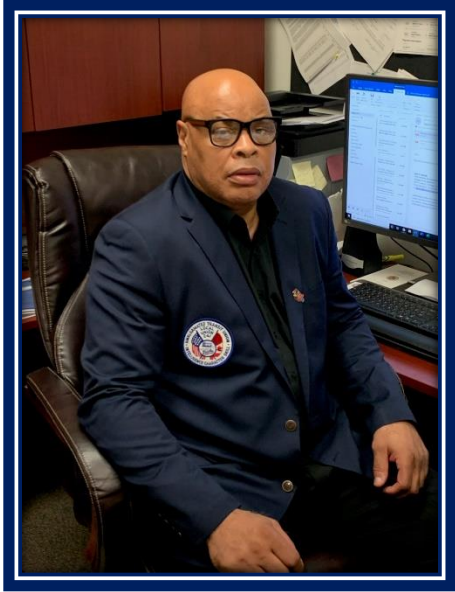
It is our belief that this is still an external issue that is possibly occurring at the post office. Our investigation is still open on this matter. July 2022

For the month of July, I was assigned to North Park Garage to do discipline as well as assisting the other North, West and South Side Garages including Pace West, Pace Northshore and Pace Southwest locations. In addition to doing various duties assigned by President Keith Hill and corresponding 1st Vice President duties.

SAFETY FOR OPERATORS

Please have limited conversations with passengers. They are trying to find anything and everything to attack us; and to make it no better, when we protect ourselves from passengers coming up in our face to spit on us or invade our space and we get them up off of us. CTA is trying to discipline members with excessive "Gross Behavior", ***So Please Beware!***

PLANNING MEETING

We still have the top brass in the planning department, who is pulling all the strings on what's going on with/to the routes.

For Example:

1. Late relieving on the streets, they would rather save a few dollars, by having you all relieved after 2100 hrs. instead of pulling into the garage. Our safety is not their concern. Myself and President Hill is working on that in every meeting.
2. Dangerous relief points are still a problem. Members please beware of your surroundings at all times.

3. CTA is losing the terminal at Chicago State University for the #3 King Drive and the #4 Cottage Grove routes. Myself and President Hill is trying to get them to make 95th and Redline the new terminal, but we are getting a lot of push back from CTA.
4. Please close your protective safety shield. CTA is giving out “*Safety Violations*”, if you are involved in an accident/incident with the shield open.

MEETING WITH CTA MANAGEMENT AND MAYOR LIGHTFOOT

Myself and President Keith Hill, ABA Maintenance Marqueal Williams, FRST Toi Bowers, Executive Board Members Tiant Gatewood and Claudell Cain, Steward Michelle Townsend, CTA’s President Dorval Carter, Chief Transit Officer Donald Bonds, CTA Security Team, CPD Police Commander’s and Alderwoman Emma Mitts were in attendance. We discussed the safety of our members and educated the members on what to try to do in different issues.

It's going to be a challenge for both sides, but we need CTA and the City of Chicago to help protect the members better.

PACE SOUTHWEST

Myself and President Keith Hill attended a meeting held at PACE Southwest, discussing with the members regarding the vacant Steward position, garage morale, new management micro managing and the upcoming pick. There will be a follow-up meeting and we will keep you posted.

FMLA

We are still experiencing members not calling REED GROUP when taking FMLA. ***PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE if you taking FMLA, PLEASE KEEP RECORDS that you did call. CTA is giving out 29-day suspensions and/up to discharge if you are found in violation for not calling the REED GROUP.***

WEINGARTEN RIGHTS

Management is not honoring member’s rights to have Union representation. If it’s not an accident or drug test and if you ask for Union representation, you have up to the next Union Day to bring the Union representative in with you. Please contact your Union representative or Officers, if this is not happening.

EXPEDITED ARBITRATION

I attended Expedited Arbitration along with President Keith Hill via Zoom Conference Call. We submitted 75 cases; Winning 52 cases by way of “*Allowed*” or “*Allowed In-Part*”; and 23 cases were “*Denied*” by an arbitrator. All were done with NO lawyer involvement, only cost for arbitrator fees.

5-DAY LETTER

Members, if CTA sends you a 5-day letter, **PLEASE CALL** your Business or Senior Manager at your garage **A.S.A.P.** or you will be **“Administratively Separated”!!!!**

Please update your phone number and address information with CTA and the Union Office, wherever there is a change.

PENSION

The Pension is solvent with 1.9 billion dollars in it.

I would like to start off by saying, Peace and Blessings to Local 241 members; I hope you and your families are in good health and in the best of spirits.

As the 2nd Vice President, I have the responsibilities to represent the Local and its members assigned by the President.

I attended a Pre-Arbitration hearing at 567 W Lake Street with President Keith Hill and 1st Vice President Eiland.

SAFETY FOR MEMBERS

In the month July once again, we have had several cases of shootings, multiple robberies and Operators being disrespected by passengers. We must take this very seriously. I spoke with several managers about these issues to find a solution on how we should deal with the disrespect. However, we should not become desensitized believing or thinking it's normal behavior. We are ***Professional Bus Operators, Mechanics, Servicers, Janitors ...etc.***

GARAGES

I visited all bus garages: 74th Street Union Steward Michelle Townsend is still working hard keeping members employed; 77th Street Union Steward Perry Thornton and Executive Board Member Claudell Cain dealt with Sleep Apnea; Chicago Executive Board Members Kelvin Gilkey, Lamar Daniels and Union Steward Rashida Tramble have overturned many grievances; Forest Glen Executive

Board Member Jack Bayer and Union Steward Orlando Robinson assisted with writing grievances and have won several grievances; North Park Union Steward Baseemah Townsend assisted saving our members also withdrawing grievances; Also working with 103rd Street Executive Board Member Clarence Covington regarding our members with RELIGIOUS EXEMPTIONS THAT ARE BEING DENIED AND ARE BEING DISCHARGED.

DRUG HEARING

I would like to please express to our members that we have 3 hrs. to give 45ml of urine. Stop trying to beat the system. If you did not have approximately 8hrs to 10hrs before your shift starts and you have been DRINKING, please stay home or go into the sick book and truly you might just need the EAP (Employee Assisted Program). Once again Alcohol is the number one cause of death. STOP!!! *Please Drink Responsibly.* Alcohol abuse is one of the most prevalent forms of addition in the United States. Most individual's suffering from alcohol addiction often don't know the dangers. **FYI-** THC (Tetrahydrocannabinol) found in *Edibles, Weed, Marijuana, Pot, Reefer, Ganja, Mary Jane, Dope, Grass, Exotic (ZA), etc....* in the United States of America had sales hit a record 17.5 billion from American's Consumption.

For the month of July there was 3-Discipline Hearings: 3 SAP (Substance Abuse Program). Ours members that might need outside, one-on-one counseling, *Please Call Recovery Centers of America 1800 RECOVERY (1800 732 68379).*

PENSION

Pension Fund is an over 1 billion 939 million dollars and the members contributed 13.324% and 60% funded and the members are paying 1%.

Assistant Business Agent Report

Disabled Bus Field Procedure

The operator of the Disabled Bus must establish a "Safe Zone" when you arrive on to the road call and determine that the bus is not in a safe zone, (in the middle of I-94) before you relinquish the good bus, the Operator and the Supervisor MUST make every effort to put that bus in a Safe Zone for the Maintenance Employee. If the bus is not in a Safe Zone "DO NOT RELINQUISH THE BUS YOU CAME ON" until you get established that the Supervisor will remain on the scene.

You must make sure that you have a way to reach the CTA Control Center, the Bus Garages do not have a Mobile Device or care to give you one, we once had a garage cell phone when we go on road calls, also the Manager will not allow us to carry one of the Supervisor Radio for us to have a way to call the Garage or Control because guess what when we go on a dead motor, the entire bus is DEAD and we have no recourse to call the Bus Garage or Control, besides the bus supervisor, also when you call the garage and you're out on an emergency road call, **(9) nine time out of (10) ten we get no answer from the garage management**, you must get in contact with the CTA Control Center in an emergency situation, or call 911.

Personal Point this what kills me is the Authority make no kind of effects to make sure we are ok while on the Road Call, but when we get back to the garage, we have to be harassed by Management asking "who gave you permission to call for a tow", as if Management got off their ass to go out and diagnosis a bus. What make that manager think that If the Bus Operator could not drive that bus safely, WHAT MAKE YOU THINK THAT THE Maintenance Employee not allow to call for a Tow.

Maintenance if you need a tow CALL FOR A TOW, you make the call. Especially AT CHICAGO AVE GARAGE, PRESIDENT KEITH HILL, MARQUEAL WILLIAMS AND THE ENTIRE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF LOCAL UNION 241 STANDS BEHIND THIS. Don't be that HERO Employee that drives that bus in and kill someone or yourself.

Things to remember before you relinquish a bus

- Am I in a Safe Zone?
- If the temperature below -40 degrees and if the bus is a dead motor before relinquishing the bus you must make sure the supervisor is going to stay with you, or you have a place to stay warm, even if we must have the Mobile Repair Truck to sit with you.
- If the bus is disabled and the temperature outside is above 95 degrees you should carry enough water on the road call, and make sure the disable has a tow truck on the way and if it is too hot

to remain on the bus you must make sure the supervisor is going to stay before you relinquish the bus

- Dead Motor **"The Driver of the responding vehicle will assist the Bus Mechanic in making the battery change"**. If the manager give you a dead motor road call ASK the manager do you want me to take batteries if the answer is YES you must ask for assistance on the road call, there should be (2) two people on the road call changing batteries, if the manager have to call a mobile truck out to the scene or have a Servicer 1 assist you on the road call (whatever) but make sure you're not alone, if you are by yourself and the operator do not want to assist you call CTA Control Center for assistance using the dead bus radio, because CTA refuses to give us a Radio or Cell Phone for emergency usage. If you ask a supervisor to use his radio, 992-to-Control is the what you say on the radio and wait for a response. And if Control Center ask for a 10-21 reply negative.
- Wear protective gear Safety Vest.

COVID-19

We are still in the State Of A Pandemic, if you feel that you need to wear a mask and remain 6 ft apart you can. It was a time that CTA had given referrals for discipline because members took the initiative to try to protect themselves, while waiting at the time clock at Kedzie Garage CTA have given behavior violation and suspending several members for not wearing masks as they were clocking out. The Maintenance Employee worn the Mask the entire shift.

If you feel sick, go get a COVID TEST, call the garage and let them know, if you get a negative result on your second day return to work with no issue, on your SECND Day you must call Reed-group and let them know you're waiting on a Covid Result and get a claim number and call the garage with that claim number. You will not be discipline once you come back with the necessary Negative results, but if you call in having Covid Symptoms and come back 5 days later without being tested you may be subject to discipline.

- Wearing a Mask is optional at this point.
- Hepacide Quat II should be still enforced if asked. Mimms Machine should be wiped down. Driver Area should be still wiped down.
- E-MIST should be done every night, if it's not getting done at your location contact Marqueal Williams or President Keith Hill.
- Gloves and Masks should still be available upon request, if not please contact your Union Rep at your location.

While you have most of CTA Headquarters working from home and managers is protected in the office we are the workers on the germ-infested bus, we are the workers serving the general public, and we are the workers that put our lives on the front line every day.

Overtime

Overtime is Wide Open at all garages for Mechanic and Servicers, the Union and Management agrees to put out a Sign-n-Sheet for each day, so do not file a grievance on overtime and you did not sign the overtime sheet starting August 1, 2022. When coming in for Overtime you are subjected to do any work that is available.

PACE (West) (Southwest) (Northshore)

Employee Assistance Program for pace is to assist with the employee personal, work-related and emotional concerns. Pace is not like CTA if you have a substance abuse problem, no matter how long you've been at Pace if you piss dirty you will be up for termination. But at the CTA you have a chance to enroll into the drug – alcohol program.

If you are getting overwhelm and need help with separation/divorce, dealing with management or difficult co-workers, grief and loss, depression, mental health, the number you can call is 1-866-440-6556. The EAP is brought to you by Humana and Pace connecting communities.

REAL ID

As the ATU International Convention is schedule for September remember to board on any commercial airplanes or enter certain federal facilities you may have a REAL ID.

To see if you have a REAL ID look at the upper right-hand corner of your driver's license, if not you must use your pass-port with your regular license. To obtain a REAL ID you have several options, Unexpired U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport Card along with your U.S. Birth Certificate. Option (2) two Social Security Card along with your W-2, both options accompanied with a recent Utility, Credit Card, Doctor or Hospital Bill, Bank Statement, Valid homeowners, renters or car insurance policy.

Labor Management Meeting

On July 20, 2022 the Union and CTA addressed several issues that pertains to the Maintenance Department, Marqueal Williams, Tim Westhoff, John Magnum and President Keith Hill participated in the meeting. The major issues are maintaining the current employees and securing our future workforce, ideals that was brought to the table is;

- Night Premium adjustment
- Removing progression for New Employees and competitive wages for Current Employees, Hiring for Mechanic.
- Bonus for current employees and sign on Bonus for New Employees
- Increasing overtime from 12 hours to 16 hours options
- Powertrain, HVAC, Radio, & Mobile Repair training for all employees by the next system pick 2024.
- Line Instructor
- Garage issues, Hoists, Lights, Scrubbers, Ventilation, Reels, Catwalks replacements, Fans and A/C units.

At Kedzie Garage a new wall A/C unit will be installed in the lunch room, and at North Park a new window unit is being ordered for the lunch room. Each garage will receive a New A/C Robin-Air Machine, also a new scrubber will be ordered for each location. And all garages will have mules, maybe not a new one but each garage will have one.

WORKERS' RIGHTS AMENDMENT

Illinois has a chance to make history and protect collective bargaining rights in the November 2022 elections, the Illinois General Assembly voted to put the Workers' Right Amendment on the ballot

this year for voter approval, this amendment protects organizing and collective bargaining rights and stop politicians from intervening in the agreements reached by union workers and their employers.

Unions working together with the AFL-CIO, American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations is the largest federation of unions in the United States it makes up 56 national and international unions together representing more than 12 million active and retired workers. ATU, IBEW, AFSCME, is just some of the unions working hard to make sure workers' rights and collective bargaining is protected. Collectively Bargain grows jobs and deliver economic growth most effectively, strong economics are built from the middle out, not the top down. Building a stronger, more vibrant middle class will provide all workers with a more direct path to economic opportunities. Passage of the Workers' Rights Amendments will protect Illinois workers from political attacks and it will benefit working families, business and the state economy.
