REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT B/A KEITH D. HILL SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER 2020

Below is my report for the month of SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER 2020, presented to the Executive Board for the Zoom Executive Board Meeting on October 28, 2020.

- > The past two months have been challenging and hard work for Local Union 241 with many things we had to address and watch. The cost of health care for the pensioners, and the fight against service cuts and layoffs. Members, please understand service cuts is a layoff!! If they reduce service that means less work, so they both go hand and hand. Although the CTA has enough money to last into 2021, the fight must go on.
- PACE is in a little different of an arena but the same fight, both are hoping for money funding from the federal government in the upcoming months.

THE AUDIT:

- I would like to commend the Executive Board, Stewards and our FRST (Financial-Recording Secretary-Treasurer) Toi Bowers. In April of 2017 this administration took office with a little over \$650,000 in the bank and a large amount of unpaid bills. Toi took the job and grabbed it by the horns to safe guard the members' money. The Board stepped up and controlled the spending by making wiser choices. After taking office and receiving our first audit and having several recommendations to correct and fix things:
 - Like having receipts for petty cash
 - Not paying bills late
 - o Better records of bills

Your elected Officers, Board Members and Stewards promised to fix things under Toi's watch. I'm proud to say our FRST (Financial-Recording Secretary-Treasurer), has completed her 6th audit with no negative marks or corrections. Yes, this administration has grown this membership's money in the bank by \$1.4 million to the tune of \$2 million and growing. Toi stays on everyone in this administration to make sure things are done right, we should be proud to have someone like her to watch over our funds and I'm proud to have her by my side!!

THE AUDIT (CONT.):

➤ I would really like to congratulate our FRST-Toi Bowers on her hard work and the great job she has done with the members money and elevating Local Union 241 to a place we haven't been in almost five decades. To the Officers, Executive Board and Stewards take a bow and let's keep moving this Local forward and safeguarding things as well. The proof is in the paper and reports, great work all!!

RETIREE HEALTHCARE:

For the third year in a row this administration has held the cost or lowered the cost of healthcare for our retired Brothers and Sisters. This year we did a combination of both, held the cost for non-Medicare Brother and Sisters and lowered the cost for our Medicare Brothers and Sisters. Also, this is the first year all retirees will not see an increase in the index cost. Before this administration, the cost was raised every year with no reason why. We ask them to bring it to the Board for review before any new increase and we were able to hold the increase and it will come before the Board every year from this point on. This administration recognizes our retired Brothers and Sisters are on a fix income and we are keeping our promise to help the retired family also we have more work to do.

PRE-ARB and EXPEDITED ARBITRATION:

- > Pre-Arb was held in the month of September with a date in October.
- The month of September we took twenty-five (25) cases over winning twenty-one (21) so please welcome our Brothers and Sisters back to work.

COVID-19 slowed down the process with us not being able to meet in this arena. I'm glad we are back holding Pre-Arb; this is the Local's way of addressing discharges before a case is taken to arbitration. The wait for arbitration can be long and the Local is working on reducing the timeframe, but faced with a backlog is the history of the Local. We are working to fix the backlog and bring it as close as we can to real time.

- > Expedited was held in October.
- (84) cases went over and the Local won (57) in some form by way of the arbitrator.

The Local is looking forward to restarting Labor Management meetings for all locations to address garage issues and grievances as well. In the future we have requested dates in the upcoming months, we will keep all posted on the outcome.

We have asked PACE to restart the Labor Management meetings as well as arbitration at all locations. PACE has not agreed to small in person meetings and is open to starting things over the phone and Zoom. I will keep the members of PACE abreast on this.

MAINTENANCE:

- First let me start by saying I would like to thank the Brothers and Sister of 74th Street Maintenance Department for honoring your Steward and our Brother **Keith Edwards** and allowing us to take part in the honoring of our fallen soldier.
- Second, I sat in on a few meetings to help address a few issues with Tim Westhoff and John Mangan and I commend these Brothers for the fight and passion they put into their work.
- Finally, 3rd Vice-President Marqueal Williams, I would like to thank him as we both worked on the CTA in a few meetings for his department standing together and winning.

REALITY:

- ➤ Ridership is still more than (75%) down and there are a few things we need to do to protect our jobs and runs. It is very important to count everyone that boards the bus (including free riders) during these times. We as operators cannot let riders go uncounted, every rider counts. Push the buttons, use the bingo card, but count all who boards. The runs are built based on ridership. Ridership plays a role in the amount of buses that are on the street and the headway between buses. If the headway is increased between buses, that may mean a few buses missing from the route, which means we work harder on our routes.
- ➤ Over the past month I've been talking with many different people from elected officials to the RTA and the CTA. To push the point of why service cuts hurt not just us but the riding public. Service cuts are the same as a lay-off, if they cut routes and reduce runs that means less work for us to pick from and that will turn into less operators working.
- As the months go on, we will have deeper conversation in the year of 2021. Please count all people boarding the bus, lets help ourselves. Members that are running ahead of schedule I'm asking you to slow those buses down! Please talk to your Representative about equalizing the street, because this hurts us as well.

WARMING BUSES:

- We understand during these times and with the prediction of COVID-19 cases rising and the city going backwards to phases, for the need of buses.
- ➤ We've had several meetings in September and October to try to help all locations with buses. We need the help of the membership to ensure we are covered during these times. A few locations might ask the last person who is making a relief on certain streets to pull the warming bus in at the end of the day, please remember this is for us to have a place to seek refuge from the elements and have lunch, so let's work as a team.

WARMING BUSES (CONT.):

Some locations we are asking to have a roaming bus to take cover from the elements, for example Forest Glen has a bus that travels down Central from Diversey to Jefferson Park allowing the operators to be out of the elements and grab something to eat. Other locations will see buses at locations like 104th & Torrence.

REED GROUP:

- ➤ The Local has called for our fifth meeting with CTA and the REED Group. There are several issues going on with REED Group and the members.
- We are having too many denials because something wasn't answered the way they like or the doctor didn't go deeper into detail or the time or frequency is too often is one reason.
- The second is there is a major communication gap from CORVEL to REED Group to the CTA, no one is talking which is causing members to be discharged or considered AWOL.
- The Union has proved this is not the fault of the members, if I start out hurt on your bus and they deny the claim how can you say you don't know my status Bull@#\$% and we will be addressing this.
- Another problem is the reporting of FMLA, remember if you take FMLA you have a few days to report your claim please remember to report it!!! By reporting your FMLA you are warding off problems so please remember to report it the same day.
- REED Group has been denying members the right to go in the sick book because they don't qualify for FMLA. This is not right, you don't need FMLA to go in the sick book and should not be denied.
- Sick book only makes the entry non-chargeable and full timers with more than one year of service are paid a benefit and are being held up and denied because they don't qualify for FMLA and this is not a rule. Please reach out to the Union if you think you have been harmed.

LEGISLATION:

- ➤ The time is now for this Local to push Springfield and get a few things done to help us.
- ➤ We must revisit and reintroduce our safety on the bus. Before COVID-19 hit, a bill was introduced in Springfield to provide or that will allow us to secure ourselves. At one time CTA had its own security detail and protected ourselves.
- ➤ Over the past few months, we have been working on CTA to go to Springfield to address the pension, to lower what we are paying in both the pension and RHCT. Also, the maintenance agenda must move forward, so let's get ready to lobby and bring this home for us!!
- I think it is time Local Union 241 looks within its membership and start running our members for some of these Political and Local seats, nobody understands what we do and our value but us, win or lose we must become a player in the state and keep legislators on their toes.
- Remember the election is **November 3, 2020** please go out and exercise your right and your choice, also we must increase our numbers as registered voters within our Local in 2021.

- > CTA "Softball Season" has come to an end, and I would like to say thanks to all who played and participated during these strange times to have fun!

Local 241 Audit

Before taking office as your Financial & Recording Secretary- Treasurer in May 2017, there were many financial injustices that had been plaguing this membership for many years. I made the promise to Local 241 that, if elected, I would not waver in my resolve to not only protect this membership from trusteeship due to financial malfeasance, but to protect your money moving forward.

Uncomfortable conversations have been had. Local 241 has come to the collective understanding that this Membership will no longer be abused.

- ♦ There will be no more circumventing the Bylaws and the ATU Constitution.
- ♦ No more Stipends will be paid.
- Payroll will be actively monitored.
- The Membership will continue to have full access to all treasury reports and payroll information.
- Audits and system updates will continue.
- Safety measures have been implemented in order to prevent criminal activity internally and externally.
- Countless and unnecessary labor board charges and challenges have been answered resulting in charges against this Union being thrown out and found to have no merit.
- All of the audits that have been completed on my watch, since taking office, has been outstanding.

• The state of our Treasury is strong, healthy and growing.

Currently, I have started this term in office as strong as I ended the last term. As your Financial & Recording Secretary, I am proud to report that Local 241 has received another outstanding audit with no deficiencies and no recommendations. We have received correspondence from the ATU International Secretary-Treasurer Kenneth Kirk, informing us that our audit report has been reviewed and noted, which I have included in my report.

I continue to look for credits and any cost savings to grow our Treasury. You will see these savings recorded on our profit loss sheet whenever our treasury is credited. Thanks, Local 241 for entrusting me to a second term. I will continue to bring accountability and integrity to the office of the Financial & Recording Secretary-Treasurer.

Local 241 Pension and Healthcare Trust

All Pension and Health Care Trust payments are paid and current. The Board of Trustees meeting was held on September 24, 2020. I also attended Pension training classes held on September 14-18, 2020. Our payment to Local 241 Retirement plan is paid and current.

One of the accomplishments of this administration is that we continue to hold the line on insurance costs for our retirees. For the last 3 years, there has been no increase in our retiree's health insurance.

Payroll and Benefits Issues

Make sure your Doctor is actually sending your paperwork to Reed by requesting a fax receipt.

Garage and Property Visits

Although the work of the Secretary-Treasurer is recurring, I am determined to stay visible to the Membership. I do not come around only at election time. I am on the properties monthly. I continue to exercise an open-door policy, while following CDC recommendations to wear masks and socially distance. Members are still making appointments to see me. Some members come down just to view our treasury reports and payroll information which is always made available. Your Financial & Recording Secretary is available every day, not just election day.

A founding member of the ATU Black Caucus, he was a strong voice in support of civil rights and the rightful place of African Americans within the leadership of the ATU and the entire labor movement.

His signature call-to-arms. "Fired up and Ready to Go", will echo throughout the ATU Forever.

We hope the recipients of this year's scholarship named in his honor, will use them in part to study union and community organizing, and grow to fight injustices everywhere.

This year, the program will consist of **five scholarships each in the amount of \$8,000.00**. In addition, a **\$2,000.00**, scholarship may be awarded to a technical or vocational school applicant.

2021 ATU SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In Memory Of: Oscar "Double O" Owens

Five \$8,000.00 scholarships are awarded each year. A sixth \$2,000.00 scholarship is available for award, to an applicant who will attend a technical or vocational post-secondary school. The competition is open to ATU members, their children, and grandchildren. All applicants must meet the eligibility requirements and satisfy these Rules and Procedures. For each scholarship winner, the ATU will deposit up to \$8,000.00, with an accredited college or a technical or vocational post-secondary school, where the award winner will be attending.

RULES AND PROCEDURES

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Applicants must be either:
 - a member of the ATU in good standing;
 - the child (whether natural or legally adopted) or stepchild of a member in good standing, or of a deceased member who was in good standing at the time of his or her death:
 - a grandchild (whether natural or legally adopted) of a member in good standing, or of a deceased member who was in good standing at the time of his or her death
- 2. **Applicants must be high school seniors** planning to enter college (or technical or vocational post-secondary school) *for the first time* following graduation during the 2020 2021 school year, or previous high school graduates that have never attended college.
- 3. ATU Scholarships are **NOT** available to the following persons:
 - those who do not intend to work without interruption toward a bachelor degree or graduation from a technical or vocational school.
 - those who are attending or have already attended college, technical or vocational school,
 - spouses of members.
 - ATU International Officers, International Representatives, staff, and other employees or their dependents, or
 - those who are fully funded for tuition, fees, and books from other sources.

1. Applicants are required to write an essay of no less than 500 words and no more than 750 words in English, French or Spanish, on the subject of:

"Organized Labor's Contribution to the Welfare of the People of the United States"

For residents of the United States

or

"Organized Labour's Contribution to the Welfare of the People of Canada"

For residents of Canada

NOTE: The essay will be evaluated on an analysis of the topic - the facts and arguments that are presented, as demonstrating that the student understands the topic, and the effectiveness of the essay in demonstrating how organized labor benefits everyone, whether they are union members or not. Grammar, style, organization, and presentation will also be evaluated.

SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

The ATU International shall appoint a Selection Committee of community, academic, and labor leaders. No ATU officer, member, staff or employee, shall participate in the final selection process.

Applicants will be judged on the basis of their scholastic record, involvement in community and extra-curricular activities, and the quality of the essay submitted.

The Committee shall select five academic scholarship winners and five alternates, and one technical or vocational scholarship winner and one alternate.

Decisions of the Committee shall be final.

If a recipient is disqualified due to a failure to fulfill all Scholarship Program requirements, the ATU Scholarship will be awarded to the next qualified alternate.

The recipient(s) will be notified by mail of their award and will also be given a form to complete in order to release the scholarship funds. Upon the return of the required information, a check will be issued to the university or vocational school in the appropriate amount. The award will be restricted to the payment of tuition, books, and associated fees.

PLEASE WEAR YOUR MASK WHILE DRIVING THE BUS and IN THE GARAGE, if you are not eating! Passengers are calling in a rapid pace.

Myself, President Keith Hill and 2nd Vice President Tanno Muhammad did Expedited Arbitrations via ZOOM, arguing 87 cases; winning 56 cases with no lawyer fees or involvement, only arbitrator charges.

Myself, President Keith Hill and 2nd Vice President Tanno Muhammad did Pre-Arbitration via ZOOM arguing 25 cases and winning 21 members jobs back, with their seniority back and no lawyer involvement or arbitrators. Welcome back to all of the members. (*These are the cases that probably were not winnable in Regular Arbitration*).

I was in a ZOOM Pension meeting. We have 1.7 billion dollars in the fund.

I was assigned to be on the part-time Pension Committee. We have past and present Board Members that have or had too much of the pension contribution taken out of their checks. Meetings are starting, we will keep you all posted.

We lost our Dear Brother Keith Edwards (74^{th} Street Maintenance Steward). God be with him and with his family.

We have more Members that we have lost system wide. May God be with them and their families.

Visited 74th Street garage and I assisted Executive Board Rodney Taylor and Union Steward Michelle Townsend with withdrawing approximately 6 grievances; 103rd Street garage I assisted Executive Board Clarence Covington and Union Steward Roger Love with withdrawing (3) grievances and also had (2) members paid out; Chicago Ave. garage I worked with Executive Board Kevin Gilkey that also attended drug hearings at 567 West Lake Street-CTA Headquarters and Union Steward Brain to resolve 3 grievances by withdrawing them; 77th Street garage I assisted Executive Board Claudell Cain and Union Steward Perry Thornton; North Park garage I assisted Union Steward Baseemah Dear Townsend and Executive Board Jack Bayer and Orlando Robinson from Forest Glen bus garage worked on several cases keeping our members employed.

EXPEDITED ARBITRATION:

Keith Edwards is the current and only Local 241 Union Setward for 74th Street Garage who was sworn into his second term on January 7, 2020. Keith Edwards was a great addition to Local Union 241 Maintenance Department Representation. Before Keith Edwards, 74th Street was

represented by myself and LaMont Colemen this garage did not have any in house montoring, management use to get away with a lot. Steping up to the plate is not for everyone, many could moan and groan but when you take the time away from your family and change your livilyhood to take care of the membes that says a lot. While in our last contract negotiations Local Union 241 fought the ATU International to add Journymen status to the Locals, I went to the Micophone by myself several times and was constantly being shot down by International President John Costa, while in this fight I personally was feeling the pressure on all sides, while we had a lot of support from other Unions the International was stonewalling the Maintenance Resoulation, Keith Edwards told me you do not have to go through this alone, at the time I did not know what he was talking about until the next time I went to the Mic.. Keith Edwards was behind me, (I didn't even know) showing support, then the next several time I went to the Mic.. Keith Edwards along with all of Local Union 241 was behind me, Local Union 308 was standing up as well, showing support. Local Unon 241 had Keith Edwards family at 74th Street, along with his coworkers to present his family his Bus Stop, CTA gave him a Resolution and the Local Union 241 presented our Resolution as well, along with a Donation to his son who is in college from his Co-Workers, Liberty National and the Union Officers.



Maintenance System Pick

Fall of 2020 is the schedule for the next System Pick, upon the retirement of Maintenance General Manager Jeff Edwards the Maintenance Department is left with General Manager who is trying to take the stance that they can remove prime pick position, along with combining pick jobs. Before the Bus Servicers Apprentices, we have the same number of servicers and got the job done! You have to ask how was this done, this was done because we had Management who went through the ranks, who started as a servicer, who moved up to mechanic, who transitioned into Management and could understand how the process work. Now you have Management who comes off the street, while we have the same number of servicers, and less buses and an extra 200 bus servicers apprentices Management still can't get the work done, G/C numbers are screwed up, but Management want to make more work for the workers who making their mistakes work.

We have less mechanics than ever, and Management is making schedule EVERYDAY, even before COVID-19, at one time we were 41 mechanic short and made it work for this company. We are the lowest paid Maintenance Department at the CTA, we do more work than any other trade, our reward is let's not pay them and let's take away their weekends and Monday and Fridays and double their work loads. Its time to WAKE UP, Local Union 241 is defiantly ready for the Fight.

Let's not forget last time we had to fight was in 2015, when again they tried to removed jobs from our pick then we had to turn our System Pick into a Garage Pick in order to preserve our jobs and at the same time the CTA tried to start a Mechanic Bus Servicer Apprentice Program. President Keith Hill along with Tim Westhoff and John Mangan is all fighting hard to keep what we have, there is nothing like going in a meeting with the President of the Union in the room, to listen to the B/S that the General Manager is dishing out.

The projected System Pick is for the week of November 8th and go into effect the week of November 15th. If we have to go past the Thanksgiving Holiday to preserve our jobs then that is what we will have to do, you must understand holding up a Pick to protect what we have is part of the fight that we are all in. At some point we must make them Respect Us, and by making their short falls work every day they will always keep taking away from us, the more we make it work, the more work they will give us, and our quality way of life they will take away, as the General Manager smile in our faces, while we have no Mondays off but (9) nine people will have a Tuesdays off.

First Transit Bid Pick

As I reported in my September report First Transit and Local 241 was working together to hold off the pick because we did not wanted to make more Part Time Position, even though President Keith Hill and Marqueal Williams was assured by First Transit that if a Full Time Para Transit Operator is forced to go Part Time, they will not lose not their Full Time Benefits. President Keith Hill and Marqueal Williams is please to report that we are not losing no full-time job so far. If we should have a COVID-19 spike and businesses are forced to shut-down we will have another Bid Pick. All Bid Awards will be done on October 29, 2020.
