



REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT B/A KEITH D. HILL OCTOBER 2021

Below is my report for the month of October 2021, presented to the Executive Board on October 29, 2021 and the Members on November 2, 2021 during the Mass Membership Meeting.

VACCINE MANDATE:

- March 2020 is when the world shutdown everything, went to a standstill. People were allowed to stay home from work, the kids were made to stay home from school, the travel industry took a major hit whether it was planes, boats or buses. I dedicated a good part of my life to serve in the United States Air Force. No matter what branch you served in we took an oath, we swore to support the Constitution of the United States. It's in that defense and the defense of individual liberty the we serve our country.
- ➤ I am not pro-vaccine, and I am not anti-vaccine. I am pro-freedom; I am for each American that have the ability and is responsible to decide for themselves whether or not to get the vaccine. I do believe that whatever choice should be in conjunction with your doctor.
- The Federal Government COVID mandate has divided us as coworkers. I have seen an unprecedent amount of division and back and forth from us as coworkers, family and friends. The division has become more and more intense between those who believe in the vaccine, those who don't and those who are undecided. No matter what your belief is, Local 241 stands with you and will support you.
- > The Local challenged the policy and went to arbitration on what we believe should be negotiated or was unfair or just right crazy. The Union is still fighting the fact that a person should not lose their job over their right to choose.

CONTRACT TALKS:

- This month negotiations: We held three sessions, two was just Local 241 and one joint with Local 308. The joint meeting, both locals responded to CTA proposals and explained more in depth with two of our proposals, as CTA needed more clarity on them. Local 241 meetings went as well as to be expected, up to our last meeting we felt CTA was toying with one of our proposals and we let them know and walked out. We are scheduled to resume with three meetings in November
- The Union is still only faced with two proposals that are rejected. The Local also gained two TA's (tentative agreement) with the expectation of more in the near future. This administration truly understands and can't wait to finalize this for all the hard-working Brothers and Sisters that sacrifice themselves every day.
- ➤ To dispel this rumor!!! We have not had a conversation about a bonus since March, our proposal still stands on the table at this point. The wage proposal is a joint proposal and will not be discussed without 308 our Sister Local. We are at the point in negotiations where we are only dealing with items that deals with Local 241.
- This administration is working hard to bring this membership another contract with no loses or givebacks. WE HAVE NOTHING TO LOSE OR NOTHING TO GIVE!

EXPEDITED AND PRE-ARBITRATION & LABOR CHARGES:

- In the Month of October Local 241 held two (2) rounds of expedited arbitration to address grievances. The Local took over (130) grievances winning (106) in some form by way of the arbitrator. This administration will keep addressing the grievances and keep working to reduce the amount of time members must wait for their grievance to be heard.
- ➤ Upon taking office we had a back log going as far back as 2002 I can proudly say we have come within a 5-year window. This round of expedited closed out all of 2014. Although we still have some few contractual violations from this year and older open, we have given members a long-awaited closure that was long overdue. Our goal and push is to cut the grievances down two years by this time next year.
- Labor charges in the month of October: We had no new cases and two (2) cases dismissed.
- > Department of Human Rights, the Local has three (3) new cases opened against the Local.

PACE NORTHSHORE:

- I'm still waiting on PACE to get back to the Local with dates to start contract talks. Both parties have indicated that they are ready to start
- Also, the local is still waiting to have an election on the property to fill the position of Steward for Northshore.

PACE WEST:

- PACE has indicated they would like to start negotiations soon, the Local will still be taking proposals for a few more weeks, so please get yours in.
- ➤ We also will be trying to have a meeting to present them to the members if it is safe do to so with COVID. Also, I need members of all PACE locations, especially PACE West, to think about challenging the national safety council as a way to address accidents.

PACE SOUTHWEST:

Local 241 will be looking to set up a day for labor management in the upcoming weeks to address the open grievances for the members of PACE Southwest.

HEALTH INSURANCE RATES:

- ➤ The insurance rates are being adjusted for 2022. You will be notified of the new rates. Remember, the arbitration which we won continues to affect the rates and applies for 2022 and 2023 and affects any member who has insurance and gives you significant savings:
 - o For example, if we had not won the arbitration and you were in PPO 2 and had family coverage, the rate without the arbitration would have been 230.00. Because of the arbitration your bi-weekly payment is \$200.00 or a \$65.00 dollar per month (\$.375 cent per hour) savings in your pocket. Similarly for part timers who have family coverage the saving is \$40.00 per pay period or \$86.00 per month (56.3 cents per hour saving). Members who had single coverage in PPO 2 save \$15.60 per pay period or \$.195 cents per hour and part timers in PPO A who have single coverage save \$20.80 per pay period or 32.5 cents per hour.

Remember, the arbitration which we won continues to affect the rates and applies for 2022 and 2023 and into the new contract, it affects any member who has insurance and gives you significant savings. Your savings are as follows;

SAFETY:

- ➤ Security remains one of the most important issues of this administration. The safety of all members CTA, PACE and First Transit is top on the list of this administration. The conversation about things on the bus as well as new ideas off the bus, talks and pressure about the shield that encloses the operator are very heavy and both parties agree that it is a must.
- > Operators, Local 241 is asking please do not get off the bus to confront anyone!! Please stay on the bus.
- ➤ In this month's meeting, we talked about some activities that are taking place at the 95th redline terminal, also hot routes and asking the CTA and CPD to have more police details out for Halloween. We also asked them to not wait until this time of year to protect us to give us protection all year around.
- These meetings are held bi-weekly and we are looking for the members to help with trouble spots and danger spots, please inform the Union.

79TH AND COTTAGE:

- > Starting with the winter pick of 2021, the Brothers and Sisters of 77th Street garage will be making a relief on 71st and Cottage for their safety. This has been a battle a few years in the making, the change has been made.
- The recommended way of travel is the redline to 69th at that point you can either take the #30 or the 71st which will give the operators two buses to take to the new relief point. More details will be coming to the 77th Street garage members next month.

PENSION CONFERENCE:

I attended a Pension Conference in Denver Colorado. As a trustee, we are required by law to have so many credit hours of continuous education to sit on the plan. I completed 13 credit hours of classes when the requirement is 11. Not only did I attended classes that will help with the pension, I attended a few classes to help with the membership. The cost of insurance is a concern whether you are retired or active and what can be done to control that cost. Also, I attended classes on the effects of mental health and how to get the company to acknowledge and address this issue. I also attended host of other classes.

- I would like to inform the members of Local 241 they will not see a pension increase in 2022 and also the RHCT will be going down to 1% from 3%. For both groups, we still have a long road ahead of us to fix many problems in some form, just work with this administration as we tackle these items.
- ➤ I'm proud to say once again this administration have held the rates for our most vulnerable members, our retirees on healthcare. The retirees will not see any increase in price for the fourth year in a row. We have heard the voices of the retirees asking for no increase.

Misc.:

- ➤ Brothers and Sisters, please stop allowing CTA and PACE to mark up your work record. Over the last month I have done a few hearings and handled discipline in all locations. When they call you in the office on a compliant, please, stop the interview and request the Union.
- We are having a few issues with payroll and seven-day sick claims, please reach out to the Union.
- Brothers and Sisters please record everyone that boards your bus, that's PACE and CTA. Ridership will play a role in the future and it will help or hurt us.
- We as operators must do a better job of looking out for each other and working better together, we are all we have on the street.
- > If you are still having a problem with the winter polo's please reach out to the Union.
- If you have received a five-day letter, please bring it to the Union's attention.
- For the next month, let's work on being one band, one sound and one group as we are each other's keeper. Let's be safe and call the Union if you need help.

BILLS

All Bills are paid and current. The Per Capita Tax (or taxes paid by Local 241 to the ATU International in order to keep our Local in "good standing,") is paid and up to date as reflected in my treasury reports.

I have provided the Executive Board and the Membership access to Local 241's treasury reports for the month of September, which includes the Profit loss, Balance Sheets, Payroll Journal and Timesheets. They are always present and available for viewing at all Executive Board and Mass Membership Meetings.

I have also issued Executive Board Minutes dated September 25, 2021. No Mass Membership Meetings will held in the month of September or October. Please watch for updates on resuming our Mass Membership Meetings. All announcements will be posted on the Union Boards at all locations

Open Grievances

- **❖** The number of open grievances for the month of October 2021 is 1707.
- ❖ This Administration, under the leadership of President Hill continues to return our brothers and sisters to work after being unjustly harmed by the Authority.
- **❖** Cases are being won with little to no lawyer involvement. This is a cost savings to the Membership.

❖ Local 241 is still resolving grievances. Your Secretary -Treasurer demands that pay issues effecting hundreds of our members be rectified immediately. In some cases, Members are eligible for quick pays.

Pension

- ❖ I attended our regularly scheduled addition to mandatory pension training on Thursday September 23, 2021. Pension Meetings are held every 4th Thursday of the Month.
- ❖ Remember members, now is a good time to make sure that you update your beneficiary information. I can't stress enough the importance of making sure your benefits are properly allocated.
- ❖ Pension payroll audit is now complete. Once the office of the Financial & Recording Secretary-Treasurer has reviewed all proper, I will pass on all information concerning the Local's next steps to the membership.
- ❖ I attended a Pension Plan conference in Denver, Colorado in the month of September along with the Officers. We attended classes on how to continue to strengthen our pension and crafting strategies to keep the fund solvent. The ATU International was also in attendance.

Contract Negotiations

Contract negotiations are in progress between CTA and both Locals 241 and 308. I attended a few contract negotiations meetings. Future dates are being established as we work toward improving our wages and working conditions. Let's continue to perform our jobs at the highest level of skill and integrity.

Local 241 Training

On October 2, 2021 I attended classes with various members of Local 241 at the University of Illinois School of Labor and Employment Relations. Topics included the history of labor unions and the power of labor. This was the first of seven classes which takes place one Saturday out the month through April. I am also attended a separate training course as well. The first class examined women in labor and their importance.

As I conclude my report, I want to continue to wish all of our members well. As the city and state reopens let's stay vigilant in our safety on and off the Job. No fair disputes. As President Hill has stressed "COUNT EVERYONE." That goes for CTA and Pace. Daylight Savings Go into effect on November 7, 2021. Please govern yourselves accordingly



<u>Assistant Business Agent – Maintenance November 2021 Report By</u> Marqueal L. Williams

Garage Pick

The CTA General Manager, Senior Managers, and Managers have come to several members saying that you are having a System Pick, as I always told you that CTA Management have never showed the Union a System Pick, as I told everyone the Union will never agree on a system pick due to manpower, the Union will never agree to violate you rights because Management cannot delegate the work assignments because they do not understand the work.

The Maintenance Garage Pick will take place beginning November 3, 2021, for 103rd, 77th, Kedzie, and Forest Glen and November 4, 2021, for 74th, Chicago, and North Park. The Pick will go into effect on Sunday November 14, 2021, Group 1 will start the pick.

Eligibility for Pick is as follows; Members who are in area 605 will have to be cleared to return to work at the close of business Tuesday November 2, 2021, for all locations picking on November 3, 2021. The deadline is November 3, 2021, for the locations picking on November 4, 2021. Members absent excess of sixty (60) days at the close of business Tuesday November 2, 2021, will not be able to pick.

After the Union had to fight another battle, we were shown a Garage Pick with the removal of the Bayman Positions, Redline Slots. The 2018 Tentative Agreement we added all positions to the Contract, this was because CTA removed positions from our pick jobs that the union had to fight to regain. Proven facts the Union was right to the CTA cannot remove the jobs without violating the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Pension and RHCT

As of October 28, 2021, the Pension Plan funding is \$2,102,860,083.05 the Multiplier Factor remains at .0215, the economy is stable, so far while this administration has been in office the Pension Ratio has not increased, the Pension Plan have reached over \$2Billion dollars.

As of October 28, 2021, the RHCT Plan funding is \$1,145,190,968.29, this plan is well overfunded with over 1Billion Dollars, starting in January 1, 2022 the contribution rate will go from 3% of paycheck to 1%, while this plan is over 158% funded there is no reason the member have to suffer and contributing extra money to an over funded plan, so President Keith Hill along with his Administration

took this fight to Springfield and change Legislation in order to bring the membership 2% of funding back on their paychecks. As I reported last month while the plan is doing so well that not only 1% will be deducted from your paycheck, but the retirees will also have to look forward to a plan deduction, and the Plan will remain overfunded.

Pace West Pick

In 2019 Pace West started blocking certain pick assignments due to manpower, starting this fall pick of 2021 the Members will have the right to pick their regular open positions first and then would pick a close position, and when a new employee comes in, that new employee would go into the position the senior member is currently working and the Senior Employee would go to his / her closed position.

Medical or Religion Accommodation Deinal

If you put in your Medical or Religion Accommodation and was denied your next step is as follows; If the CTA grants a request for an accommodation, it shall advise the employee of the accommodation and the conditions. If an employee timely submits a request for an accommodation under the Policy and the CTA denies an employee's request, the CTA shall provide the employee with no less than five weeks' notice to become fully vaccinated so that the employee may have adequate time to receive the Johnson and Johnson, Moderna or Pfizer vaccine. After you get vaccinated it is your job to enter it in the Employees Self-Service Portal. Employees who experience difficulties in providing the required proof of vaccination through the Self-Service Portal should complete a Report to Manager Form, and copies of such reports shall be made available to the Unions upon request. For everyone who did not apply for an Accommodation You Must Be Fully Vaccinated By November 1, 2021. Note: if you have the First Dosage by November 1, 2021 you may remain in service.
