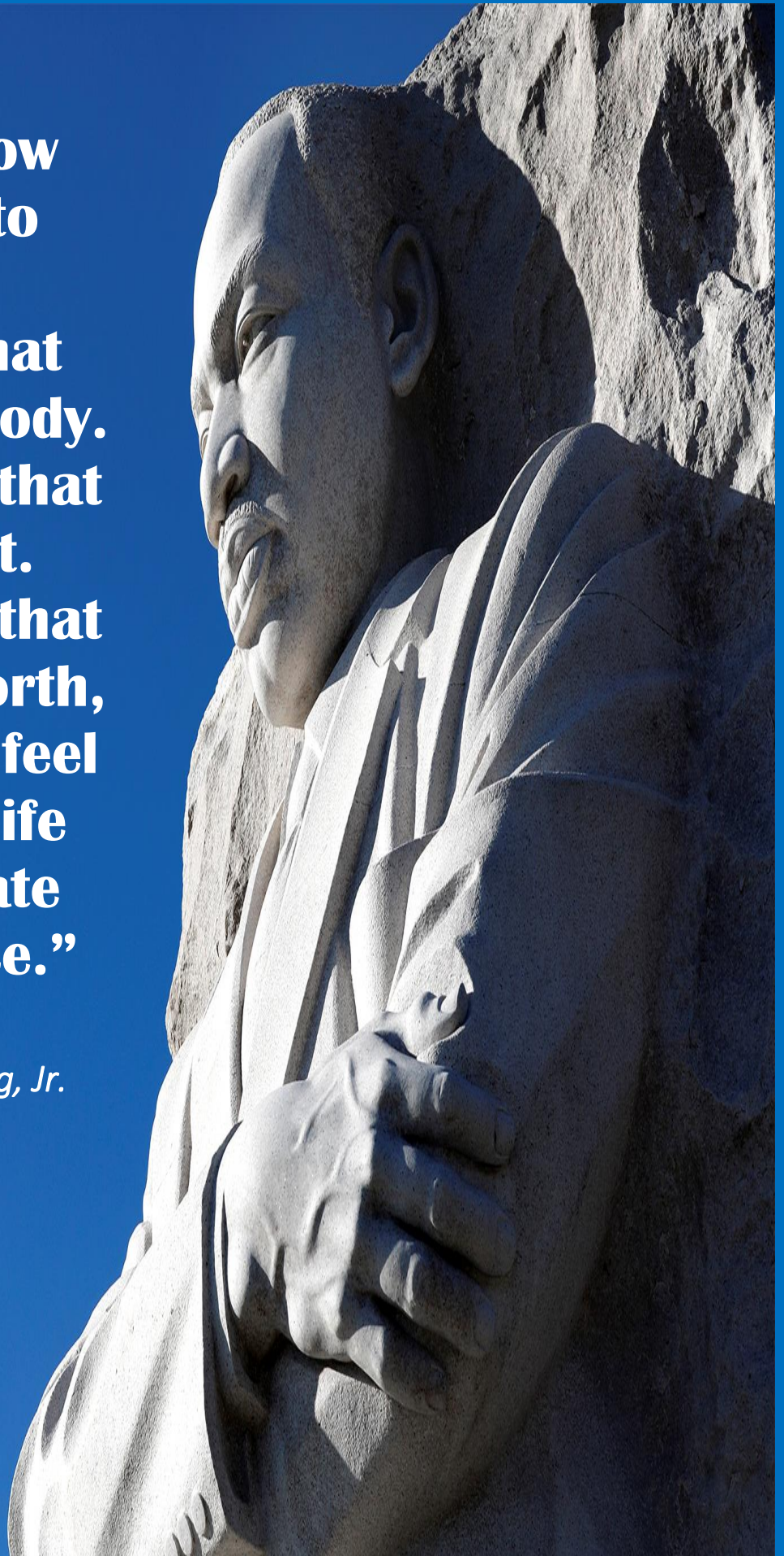

***Below is my report for the month of January 2023,  
presented to the Executive Board on January 27, 2023  
and the Members on February 7, 2023 during the  
Mass Membership Meeting.***

Congratulations to the newly elected Officers and Executive Board Members/Stewards. I believe with the mixture that we have; the union can continue to move forward with its success.

March of 2020 the world shutdown! The workforce was given the opportunity to work from home or just stay home. The schools went remote, doctors' appointments went remote, courts went remote, at one point you had to be doing an essential job to move around the city and several states. Since March of 2020, we have been coming to work moving the city, suburbs and counties. The Brothers and Sisters of CTA, PACE and First Transit, whether you are a driver, servicer, mechanic or clerk and all others in the 241 unit, we played a major role to make sure people were able to get to and from their destinations.

During this time every elected official labeled us as an essential service and we are not in a disagreement with that. I have been talking with state and local Legislatures, Alderman and Alderwomen and members of the County Board. The job we do is a service but without the worker it does not move. On all levels, I'm trying to get us acknowledged as **ESSENTIAL WORKERS!!!** I would like us to be placed on the list and called just that!!! This will not be an easy fight although everyone I talked with and expressed the value; we are in agreement. This is one of the fights we are putting together on all levels.

We also will be following up on our safety agenda from last year and pushing to get our bill over the hurdle this year. **We do not come to work to get assaulted!!!**

**PACE WEST:**

- We will be starting back up with our Labor Management meetings with PACE starting in February to address items that the members bring to the union.
- There are a few members who are waiting on agreements dealing with open grievances or contractual problems to be resolved. I'm pleased to say, things have been finalized and you should be made whole. If you have any more questions please reach out to the union.
- One member was returned back to work from the December meeting.

**PACE SOUTHWEST:**

- Local 241 will be sending a letter to start contract talks with PACE on behalf of the members at SOUTHWEST, this month. Although the contract does not expire until July of 2023 the process will be starting.
- Brothers and Sisters please be on the lookout for contract proposals forms, please take a second and fill them out and let us know items and changes you would like to see in the contract.

### PACE NORTHSORE:

- I would like to thank all members of PACE Northshore for taking a second to vote on the TA (tentative agreement).
- The TA (tentative agreement) has to be approved by the PACE Board. After it is approved, the members will be made whole with contractual agreements.

### SAFETY:

- First, I would like to introduce the two new representatives sitting on the safety committee along with myself, Angelique Williams from 103<sup>rd</sup> St. will represent the Southside (103<sup>rd</sup>, 77<sup>th</sup>, 74<sup>th</sup>) and Antoine Trimuel from Chicago will represent the Northside (Kedzie, Chicago Ave, North Park and Forest Glen) Angelique and Antoine will be addressing the membership concerns and bringing ideas to the table about the safety of our members. Also, they will be voting on items brought forth concerning safety for Local 241 members.
- Both have attended one meeting so far and it went well. In our future, meetings here are some of the ideas that we will be asking for:
  - More lighting in our parking lots.
  - Less access from the public on our parking lots.
  - Working cameras in the parking lots.
  - Police presence on our routes and certain reliefs points.
  - Transit detail riding longer than two blocks and riding where we need them.
- Also, we will be approving a new system to help with the silent alarm system, dealing with the lights on the buses to notify any police in our area or that come across our bus. Brothers and Sisters, your voice and ideas are welcomed, please email one of us and let us bring your idea to the table:

- CTA has started to get more buses in with the fully enclosed shields, with well over 100 buses now and counting. We will continue to push the CTA for a faster turnaround until the entire fleet is covered.

**LINE INSTRUCTOR:**

**What does it mean to be a line instructor?**

- Line Instructor is the first step of getting off the bus and moving into certain jobs. CTA stopped line instruction classes altogether going as far back as 2008 through 2017 until the union had them restart the classes. Fast forward today, we have had many classes from supervision, bus clerks and instructors as well as other jobs within the company.
- We know that the CTA do not have enough line instructors to train the students because of the lack of postings for the job. We saw this as a deliberate act to keep operators from advancing in the company. We know many operators that are not certified line instructors will take students (Local 241 Thank You) and train them.
- Some of us, the company use to train new Brothers and Sisters but then deny us because of our work record. Local 241 is asking all members who have trained a new operator, to apply for line instructor regardless of your work record. **Brothers and Sisters please take a second and apply.**

**MAYORAL FORUM:**

- Local 241 was invited and honored to host and moderate this event. The forum had seven out of the nine candidates in attendance. This forum was held at Quinn Chapel AME Church, Sunday January 15, 2023. It gave 241 a chance along with others to see how the candidates view transit and value us as workers. We have a few more groups trying to partner with 241 to hold a forum with the candidates.
- I'm glad we are having the opportunity to keep us in the forefront and stay a focus in the city politics. Over the last few months, we have also had numerous candidates visit and talk with the board from the Mayor to Alderperson seeking 241 endorsement and support.

**MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT:**

- Myself and ABA of Maintenance Marqueal Williams are waiting to resume meetings dealing with some unfinished work for this department. We have been slowed by vacations and waiting on both parties to get back together. CTA has indicated that talks will continue with this matter and the union will not stop until we deliver on this.

**LABOR MANAGEMENT:**

- Local 241 held Labor Management meetings for all garages. The meetings were held to address the moral and issues that affect the members. These meetings will be held every quarter so please let your union rep know what concerns you may have.

### EXPEDITED, PRE-ARBITRATION, LABOR CHARGES & STEP II HEARINGS:

- In the Month of January, Local 241 did not hold “*Expedited Arbitration*”. Local 241 will be addressing over 300 grievances in the month of February.
- This administration will keep addressing the grievances and keep working to reduce the amount of time members must wait on receiving a final decision.
- “Pre-Arbitration” meetings were not held in January. The Local will be starting “Pre-Arbitration” meetings again in February.
- Labor charges in the month of January: **we had no new cases**. The Local also had three (3) cases dismissed.
- We also had five (5) letters of complaints/charges written to the International against the Local. Five (5) were responded to and all complaints/charges were dismissed and closed as unfounded.
- I also handled Step II grievance meeting this month addressing (46) cases, winning (17), withdrawing one (1) and moving the other on to the next step of the process.

### JOB FAIR:

- On January 28, 2023 Local 241 and the Chicago Transit Authority will hold its 5<sup>th</sup> job fair.
- This job fair is scheduled to have over 1000 people in attendance, which is a good number for the fourth in-person job fair.
- Local 241 has Partnered with the CTA to assist in helping with the hiring. We see it as a way to help and give us an opportunity to get our family and friends hired.
- We will be holding another job fair in the upcoming months, so please be on the lookout and let’s help get our friends and family a job with us to earn a great living.
- I would like to thank the Officers, Executive Board Members and Stewards who represented Local 241 at this fair and everyone who helped put the word out about the fair. **Remember all jobs are now full-time positions!!**
- We will keep pushing the CTA to hold job fairs to help with the manpower.
- I will be meeting with the CTA to hire more veterans from United States Military.

### **ILLINOIS SICK AND BEREAVEMENT LEAVE:**

The Illinois Legislature passed two bills addressing employee leave that are effective January 1, 2023. The Family Bereavement Leave Act (“FBLA”) amended the Child Bereavement Leave Act (“CBLA”) and provides eligible employees with unpaid time off to grieve a death of a covered family member and it provides time off due to certain pregnancy-or adoption related events. A recently enacted amendment to the Employee Sick Leave Act (“ESLA”) which was originally passed in 2017 sets minimum standards for all workers who have sick days, other than through a disability program.

The FBLA would apply to CTA employees but the original ESLA has never been applied to the CTA and the amendments would not as the CTA employees are covered under a short-term disability program, which is exempted from coverage. Set forth below is a summary of both Acts for your use.

#### **1. The Family Bereavement Leave Act**

Employees will be eligible to take FBLA leave if they are eligible under the FMLA, which requires at least 12 months of employment and at least 1250 hours worked within the previous 12 months. The FBLA does not create a right to take unpaid leave exceeding or in addition to the time permitted by the FMLA.

Effective January 1, 2023 eligible employees will be entitled to use a maximum of two weeks (ten work days) of unpaid bereavement leave to:

- a. Attend the funeral or alternative funeral of the covered family member.
- b. Make arrangements necessitated by the death of a covered family member.
- c. Grieve the death of the covered family member.
- d. Be absent from work due to 1) miscarriage, 2) an unsuccessful round of artificial insemination, still birth, a diagnosis that negatively impacts pregnancy.

Appropriate notice (48-hour advance notice) and complete the leave within 60 days after the date the employee receives notice of the death of the covered family member or occurrence of pregnancy related or adoption related event. Reasonable documentation may be required.

Finally, an employee covered by a cba that provides leave may elect to substitute leave provided for leave under the statute (the 10-day period). Therefore, paid days under the CBA would count against the leave.

### ILLINOIS SICK AND BEREAVEMENT LEAVE (Cont.):

#### **2. The Employee Sick Leave Amendment**

The ESLA does **not** require Illinois employers to provide any sick leave to employees. However, under the ESLA, if an Illinois employer provides sick leave or a paid time off benefit, as defined in the Act, employees must be able to use at least a portion of such time to care for certain relatives. ESLA requires an employer to allow an employee to use such time “for absences due to an illness, injury, medical appointment, or the personal care of the employee’s covered family member (including the employee’s child, stepchild, spouse, domestic partner, sibling, parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandchild, grandparent or stepparent) on the same terms upon which the employee is able to use a personal sick leave benefits for the employee’s own illness or injury.” The amendment also allows a person to provide transportation for a family member to medical appointments, and to ensure that a covered family member’s basic medical, hygiene, nutritional or safety needs are met where the family member is unable to meet those needs. The employer may limit the amount of sick leave to be used for a covered family member to ½ the employee’s maximum annual grant of such leave.

The amendment signed into law provides that effective January 1, 2023, the rights afforded under the ESLA serve as a minimum standard in the negotiated collective bargaining agreement where a paid sick day benefit is provided.


However, an employment plan or paid time off policy does **not** include long term disability, **short term disability**, an insurance policy, or other comparable benefit plan or policy. Furthermore, **the Act provides that “noting in the Act shall be construed to invalidate, diminish or otherwise interfere with any collective bargaining agreement nor shall it be construed to invalidate, diminish or otherwise interfere with any party’s power to collectively bargain.”**

Because the CTA plan is a short-term disability plan, the Act’s provisions are inapplicable to it. If the members would like to explore Sick Days in replace of the Sick Book, we are starting contract negotiations this year. Please let the Local know, so we can include them with our proposals.

### BEREAVEMENT AND CONDOLENCES:

Unfortunately, we have loss several members in the last week alone. Please let’s get back to caring and loving for one another and becoming a family again. Let’s keep the families and fellow members in our prayers.

# Assistant Business Agent - Maintenance Report

***My name is Marqueal L. Williams I am the Assistant Business Agent for ATU Local 241. My job is to oversee all CTA & Pace Maintenance and First Transit Paratransit Operators. I am also the President of the ATU Illinois Joint Conference Board.***

## **Labor Management Meeting**

Several Garages are missing a Push Tug, in order to push a disabled bus from the bays to the hoist to be repaired, CTA has ordered Tugger Pullers for every garage. And for the outside garages I'm still in talks with CTA about ordering new Push Tugs because dealing with the snow and other environments such as uneven grounds, rain etc...

We discussed training in the garages, Kedzie Garage had training upstairs, currently the Maintenance Training Room at Kedzie Garage is being upgraded and transformed for in-house garage training,

HVAC, Radio/ Bench, Powertrain & Mobile Truck / Trouble-Track classes are my focus points that the members complained about during my campaigning.

77th Street garage issues such as water pressure, tug and scrubber repair, new jumper and air compressor. Results are we will send that tug across to the shops for repair, a new scrubber is on order and water pressure has been repaired.

77th, North Park, and Forest Glen we are looking into putting overhead heaters at the pumps, this is long overdue and should have happened over 25 years ago, with technology advancing this should be done by next winter.

Tire & Radio, 701 Positions, we have (2) two mechanics that will move into the tire and radio position within the next two weeks,, and we have (3) three mechanics who are in line to transition to the 701 position.

47 new mechanics is in the pool for hiring, also we had a Job Fair Saturday January 28, 2023, with the new pay increase we hope that this incentive bring in new mechanics, we haven't had this many potential candidates in years, the following information is from January 5, 2023 meeting (6) six in training, (7) seven passed the interview and will start the next week, (15) fifteen is being scheduled and (16) sixteen will take the practical.

## **Committees and Agenda**

I have started a Bus Servicer Committee. The committee members consist of Larhon Brownlee (773)798-1232 and Malcolm Holmes(773)354-4857. We met

with Bryan Robinson for an introductory meeting and also dealt with several Bus Servicer Apprentice issues. Any Bus Servicers or Bus Servicer Apprentices who have any suggestions or ideas on ways to make your job easier or need extra equipment please feel free to give your committee member a call, as I Promised during my campaign, I have started a Bus Servicer Committee and we will meet with CTA bi-monthly.

Bus Servicer Apprentice (BSA) I will be working with President Keith Hill and Learning and Support to have a Job Fair for the Bus Servicer Apprentices, also working to get the day classes restarted back at 567 to give the BSA an advantage to obtain full time employment.

The Accredited Training Committee met on January 25, 2023, your committee members are John Mangan and Tim Westhoff along with Marqueal Williams and Keith Hill, our last meeting was before the 241 election. We left off waiting for funding approval from the State of Illinois, now this has been approved. We are moving forward with Registering the program with the Department of Labor and giving them the Class Syllabus, also moving forward with Daley College to make our Instructor Subject Matter Expert/Adjunct Instructor and providing the CTA with a new Power Point Agenda along with discussing wages, more Instructors and Line Instructors. I will say wages will be discussed before this Accredited Training Program is registered, the ETA of this program is July or August 2023.

I will be starting a Pick Committee for the upcoming System Pick if any member

wants to be a part of this committee call Marqueal Williams (312)888-6364, GET INVOLVED.

## **Discipline Hearings**

I was recently out during discipline interviews also training the new Maintenance Stewards, what I noticed that I had to reschedule several interviews because the member failed to call the union for representation, the Maintenance Department have set discipline days 103rd & 77th - Thursday, 74th & Kedzie - Wednesday, Chicago Ave., North Park & Forest Glen - Tuesday.

Management does not give the union reps a "heads up" that you are being disciplined. It is not CTA's responsibility to make sure you have union representation, it is your responsibility. Now here are your rights 1. The managers will give you a referral to obtain union representation for what you are being charged for. 2. You have 24 hours to obtain union, if your referral is for the following week and you forgot to call your union rep, CTA can proceed with the discipline, they have that right. You should call your union representative ASAP so your representative could start his/her investigation.

### **3%**

During negotiations in October of 2022 with CTA upper leadership, the pay for Local Union 241 Mechanics was the number one topic of discussion I have seen the Facebook posts and have responded, I've also talked to you in person about what's going on with the 3%, and I promised to now bring President Hill to talk to you as well, I do understand that what we were promised we must fight for.

CTA the Maintenance Department have settled your hiring problem by allowing you to eliminate the pay progression in a non-contract year, bringing every new employee a wage of \$40.59, now we have an abundance of applicants applying from the (2) two most recent job fairs and the third one was Saturday January 28, 2023, and it proves just looking at past job fairs that I (Marqueal Williams) solved your hiring problem.

On January 27, 2023 Donald Bonds came to Local Union 241 Union Hall and addressed the new Executive Board during this meeting Mr. Bonds spoke to all our Maintenance Department Representatives about having meetings with Local Union 241 to address the wage disparity starting next week until this is resolved, he explained that this is an issue that not only wages can fix, it comes with training as well.

During the meeting we had a long discussion about other issues that the mechanics are currently having that needs to be addressed. I will be starting a Mechanic Committee for mechanics

issues, Troy Damron and Marcin Kotarba will be on this committee. We will start meeting the week of February 5, 2023.

### **Bus Servicer Apprentice**

This is to let you know I am still currently working on the overtime Memorandum of Understanding is currently being discussed with 241 legal team and CTA legal team to bring you overtime.

## **PACE AND FIRST TRANSIT ISSUES**

### **Pace West**

Pace West has several bus wash racks that are not functioning correctly, the wash rack was poorly maintained by Pace, and Pace West management terminated the Building Maintenance person (a 241 Pick Position). Pace West management had that person working on buses more than he was fixing the wash racks and other Building Maintenance functions. Because I was successful in stopping the Building Maintenance from working on buses, Pace Management put a provision in the CBA that made this possible for the Building Maintenance person to be able to work on buses, this is page 79 of your current CBA. Now Pace West is forcing Bus Servicers who are doing Interior Clean to clean rims. Rims is not on the Interior Detail sheet and the employees at that location are saying "this is not our job", but Pace Management and the Union Rep at the location are saying that "this is your job". Pace Members if this is not your job and you have not been doing this function, I need you to fill out a grievance form that I will generate myself (Marqueal Williams) along with President Keith Hill will follow through and stop this injustice.


### **Pace Southwest**

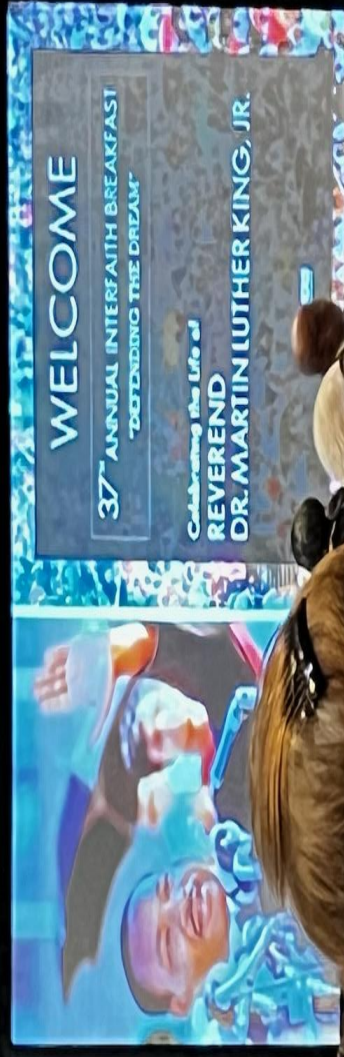

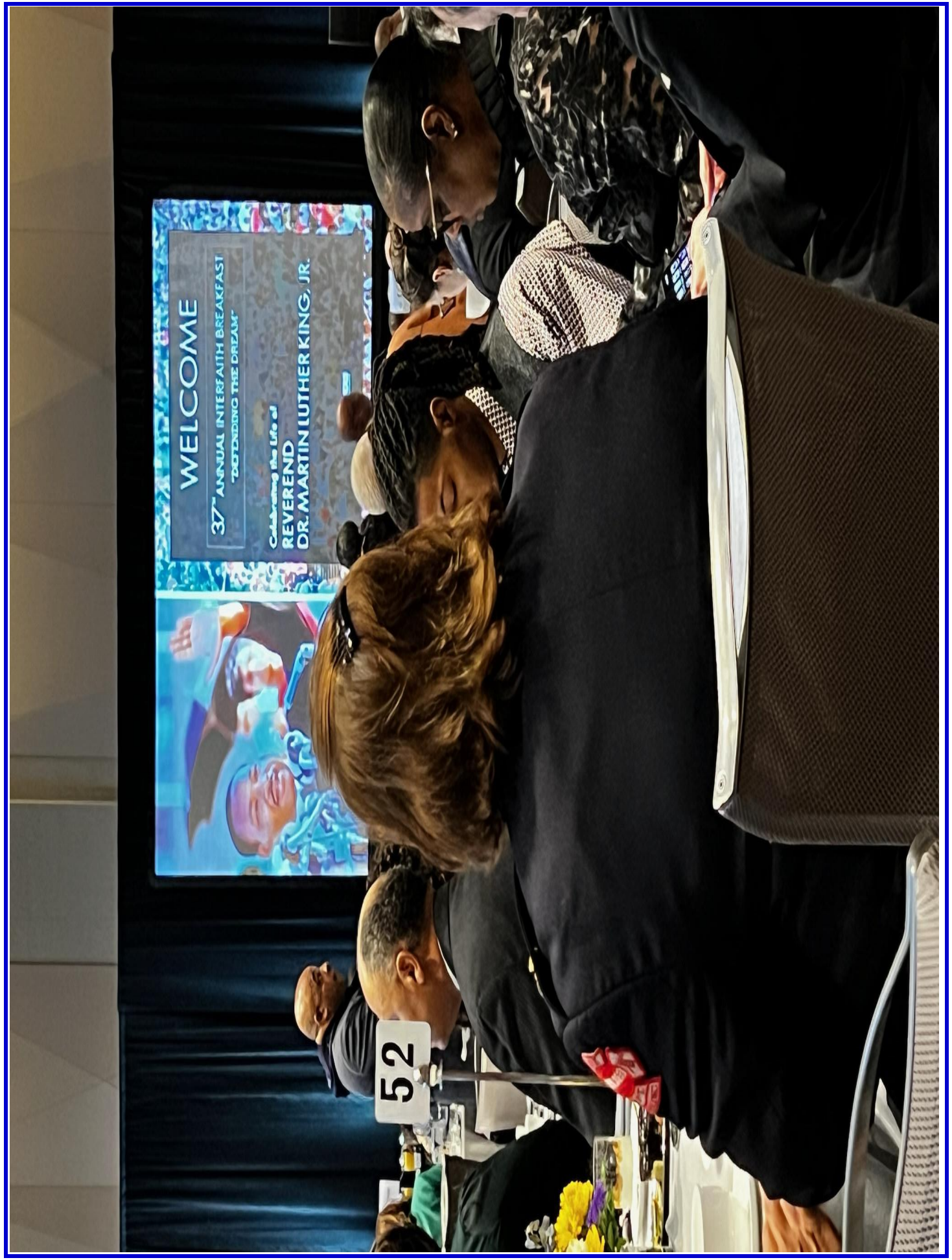
